My name is Katie Chiaverini and I am a public school teacher and resident of Johnson County, Kansas. I urge you

to vote against both SB 157 - Kansas highway patrol, immigration agreement and SB 158 - Prohibiting adoption of

sanctuary policies by cities, counties, and state agencies.

These bills are neither pro-family nor pro-child. They will instill fear in many families and children that we service

in our schools. Our families will be scared to come to the police for help if they fear deportation due to their

status as citizens. More than anything, this will directly impact the children of our school, our community, our

district, and our city. We want our children to feel safe. We want them to know that the police are here to help

them and keep them safe. We want them to trust the police just as they do their teachers. We don't want them

to see police as people who might take their parents away or take them away. Passing either of these bills will

directly impact the trust that the community has built over the past years with immigrant families, with or without

correct legal papers. We will be moving a step backwards.

I work directly with children who have just arrived in the country. We call them our "Newcomers". These

newcomers and their families are often very scared at first and we work hard to make them feel welcome in our

school and our community. Every one of these children has a name and a family. Most have experienced

incredibly long, hard, and often traumatic journeys to arrive on United States soil. They come here because their

parents had a dream of a better life for them. They wanted to have enough food in their bellies and to get a good

education to have a better life. Most of all, their parents wanted them to be safe. These amazingly hard-working

students want to learn English, they want to make friends, and they love their teachers, their school and their

families. In my first-hand experience, I know these recent immigrants to be some of the most resilient and

hardworking people around with values that embody the "American Way". These children and their families are

the backbone of our country, which was created by large waves of immigrants over time, and they deserve to be

safe. Allow our public officers to do their job of keeping people safe and keep them out of immigration duties of

the federal government by voting no to SB 157 and SB 158.
