Subject: HB 2674; Enacting the Kansas telemedicine act.

Neutral Testimony

Chairperson Schmidt and members of the committee I thank you for the opportunity to discuss HB 2674.

Telemedicine is an important piece of the health care puzzle and can plan a tremendous role in the health care delivery system, especially in a state like Kansas.

Doctor of Chiropractic in Kansas are licensed under the Healing Art Act, the same licensing act as Doctors of Medicine and Doctors of Osteopathy. Doctors of chiropractic are subject to the same rules, regulations, and standards as Doctors of Medicine and Doctors of Osteopathy.

Doctors of Chiropractic in Kansas are licensed to treat "the human condition." We do not just treat musculoskeletal conditions.

Many of my colleagues has attended advanced post-graduate training in the areas of nutrition, internal medicine, and health promotion. These areas of practice are well suited to telemedicine.

I know that HB 2674 is a very important bill to the citizens of Kansas and I look forward to seeing this committee pass HB 2674 out to the full Senate.

I ask that when the Public Health and Welfare committee work HB 2674, that one small amendment be added: on Section 2. (d) strike physician and replace with healthcare provider, licensed by the BOHA and who is acting within their scope of practice and held to the standards of professional conduct as set forth by the BOHA. And then strike Section 2. (g) "physician" means a person licensed...

HOUSE BILL No. 2674

By Committee on Taxation

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

shall be known and may be cited as the Kansas telemedicine act. New Section 1. Sections 1 through - 5 7, and amendments thereto,
