**SUBJECT:** Fiscal Note for HB 2437 by Representative Becker

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning HB 2437 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

Current law establishes the last Saturday in July of each year as the National Day of the Cowboy in Kansas. The law directs the Governor to annually issue a proclamation asking state officials to display the United States flag on all state buildings and to display the National Day of the Cowboy flag on the grounds of the state capitol building on the last Friday in July. HB 2437 would amend the law to change the National Day of the Cowboy to the fourth Saturday in July of each year. The Governor would then ask state officials to display the United States flag on all state buildings and to display the National Day of the Cowboy flag on the grounds of the state capitol building on the Friday immediately preceding the National Day of the Cowboy.

Passage of HB 2437 would not have a fiscal effect.
