

SUBJECT: Fiscal Note for HB 2503 by Representative Jones

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning HB 2503 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

HB 2503 would provide for the reinstatement of certain licenses that have been cancelled by the Kansas State Board of Healing Arts. The bill would require the Board to provide the licensee with a written notice of cancellation within 15 days from the cancellation for failure to renew. A cancelled license could be reinstated retroactively to the date of cancellation if the application for reinstatement and payment of all fees and fines are made within 90 days from the cancellation date. To reinstate the license, the Board would have to determine that the failure to renew was not intentional or caused by inexcusable neglect or mistake. HB 2503 would apply to any licensee whose license was cancelled on or after January 1, 2017.

The Kansas State Board of Healing Arts indicates that HB 2503 could increase the responsibilities and workload for the licensure staff. However, an estimate of the fiscal effect of cannot be made without experience operating under the provisions of the bill. Any fiscal effect associated with HB 2503 is not reflected in *The FY 2019 Governor's Budget Report*.
