AN ACT concerning public health; relating to pharmacists and certain
other individuals; pertaining to the administration of vaccines;
amending K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 65-1635a and repealing the existing
section.

6 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

7 K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 65-1635a is hereby amended to read as Section 1. 8 follows: 65-1635a. (a) A pharmacist or a pharmacy student or intern who is 9 working under the direct supervision and control of a pharmacist may 10 administer-influenza vaccine any vaccine to a person six years of age or 11 older-and may administer vaccine, other than influenza vaccine, to a-12 person 18 years of age or older pursuant to a vaccination protocol if the 13 pharmacist, pharmacy student or intern has successfully completed a 14 course of study and training, approved by the accreditation council for pharmacy or the board, in vaccination storage, protocols, injection 15 16 technique, emergency procedures and recordkeeping and has taken a course in cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) and has a current CPR 17 18 certificate when administering vaccine. A pharmacist or pharmacy student 19 or intern who successfully completes such a course of study and training 20 shall maintain proof of completion and, upon request, provide a copy of 21 such proof to the board.

22 (b) All vaccinees will be given a written immunization record for 23 their personal files. The administering pharmacist or pharmacist 24 supervising an administering pharmacy student or intern shall promptly 25 report a record of the immunization to the vaccinee's primary-care 26 provider by mail, electronic facsimile, e-mail or other electronic means. If 27 the vaccinee does not have a primary care provider, then the administering 28 pharmacist or pharmacist supervising an administering pharmacy student 29 or intern shall promptly report a record of the immunization to the person 30 licensed to practice medicine and surgery by the state board of healing arts 31 who has entered into the vaccination protocol with the pharmacist. The 32 immunization will also be reported to appropriate county or state 33 immunization registries.

34 (c) A pharmacist, pharmacy student or intern may not delegate to any
35 person the authority granted under this act to administer a vaccine.

(d) As used in this section, "pharmacist" means a pharmacist as

defined in K.S.A. 65-1626, and amendments thereto, who has successfully 1 completed a course of study and training, approved by the accreditation 2 council for pharmacy or the board, in vaccination storage, protocols, 3 injection technique, emergency procedures and record keeping and has 4 taken a course in cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) and has a current 5 CPR certificate. 6

- 7 (e) This section shall be a part of and supplemental to the pharmacy 8 act of the state of Kansas. 9
