AN ACT concerning state employees; relating to classified and 1 2 unclassified employees; amending K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 75-2935 and 3 repealing the existing section. 4 5 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas: 6 Section 1. K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 75-2935 is hereby amended to read as 7 follows: 75-2935. The civil service of the state of Kansas is hereby divided 8 into the unclassified and the classified services. 9 (1) The unclassified service comprises positions held by state officers 10 or employees who are: 11 (a) Chosen by election or appointment to fill an elective office; 12 (b) members of boards and commissions, heads of departments 13 required by law to be appointed by the governor or by other elective officers, and the executive or administrative heads of offices, departments, 14 15 divisions and institutions specifically established by law; 16 (c) except as otherwise provided under this section, one personal secretary to each elective officer of this state, and in addition thereto, 10 17 18 deputies, clerks or employees designated by such elective officer; 19 all employees in the office of the governor; (d) 20 officers and employees of the senate and house of representatives (e) 21 of the legislature and of the legislative coordinating council and all officers 22 and employees of the office of revisor of statutes, of the legislative 23 research department, of the division of legislative administrative services, 24 of the division of post audit and the legislative counsel; 25 (f) chancellor, president, deans, administrative officers, student health 26 service physicians, pharmacists, teaching and research personnel, health 27 care employees and student employees in the institutions under the state 28 board of regents, the executive officer of the board of regents and the 29 executive officer's employees other than clerical employees, and, at the 30 discretion of the state board of regents, directors or administrative officers 31 of departments and divisions of the institution and county extension 32 agents, except that this subsection (1)(f) shall not be construed to include 33 the custodial, clerical or maintenance employees, or any employees 34 performing duties in connection with the business operations of any such 35 institution, except administrative officers and directors; as used in this 36 subsection (1)(f), "health care employees" means employees of the

university of Kansas medical center who provide health care services at 1 the university of Kansas medical center and who are medical technicians 2 or technologists or respiratory therapists, who are licensed professional 3 nurses or licensed practical nurses, or who are in job classes which are 4 designated for this purpose by the chancellor of the university of Kansas 5 6 upon a finding by the chancellor that such designation is required for the 7 university of Kansas medical center to recruit or retain personnel for positions in the designated job classes; and employees of any institution 8 under the state board of regents who are medical technologists; 9

(g) operations, maintenance and security personnel employed to
implement agreements entered into by the adjutant general and the federal
national guard bureau, and officers and enlisted persons in the national
guard and the naval militia;

(h) persons engaged in public work for the state but employed by
 contractors when the performance of such contract is authorized by the
 legislature or other competent authority;

(i) persons temporarily employed or designated by the legislature or
by a legislative committee or commission or other competent authority to
make or conduct a special inquiry, investigation, examination or
installation;

(j) officers and employees in the office of the attorney general and
 special counsel to state departments appointed by the attorney general,
 except that officers and employees of the division of the Kansas bureau of
 investigation shall be in the classified or unclassified service as provided
 in K.S.A. 75-711, and amendments thereto;

26 (k) all employees of courts;

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(l) client, patient and inmate help in any state facility or institution;

(m) all attorneys for boards, commissions and departments;

29 (n) the secretary and assistant secretary of the Kansas state historical30 society;

(o) physician specialists, dentists, dental hygienists, pharmacists,
 medical technologists and long term care workers employed by the Kansas
 department for aging and disability services;

(p) physician specialists, dentists and medical technologists employed
 by any board, commission or department or by any institution under the
 jurisdiction thereof;

(q) student employees enrolled in public institutions of higherlearning;

(r) administrative officers, directors and teaching personnel of the state board of education and the state department of education and of any institution under the supervision and control of the state board of education, except that this subsection (1)(r) shall not be construed to include the custodial, clerical or maintenance employees, or any 1 employees performing duties in connection with the business operations of 2 any such institution, except administrative officers and directors;

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(s) all officers and employees in the office of the secretary of state;

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(t) one personal secretary and one special assistant to the following: The secretary of administration, the secretary for aging and disability 6 services, the secretary of agriculture, the secretary of commerce, the 7 secretary of corrections, the secretary of health and environment, the 8 superintendent of the Kansas highway patrol, the secretary of labor, the 9 secretary of revenue, the secretary for children and families, the secretary of transportation, and the secretary of wildlife, parks and tourism and the 10 11 commissioner of juvenile justice;

12 (u) one personal secretary and one special assistant to the chancellor and presidents of institutions under the state board of regents; 13

14 (v) one personal secretary and one special assistant to the executive 15 vice chancellor of the university of Kansas medical center;

16 (w) one public information officer and one chief attorney for the 17 following: The department of administration, the Kansas department for 18 aging and disability services, the department of agriculture, the department of commerce, the department of corrections, the department of health and 19 environment, the department of labor, the department of revenue, the 20 21 Kansas department for children and families, the department of 22 transportation, and the Kansas department of wildlife, parks and tourism 23 and the commissioner of juvenile justice;

(x) if designated by the appointing authority, persons in newly hired 24 positions, including any employee who is rehired into such position and 25 26 any current state employee who voluntarily transfers into, or is voluntarily 27 promoted or demoted into such position, on and after July 1, 2015, in any 28 state agency;

29 (y) one executive director, one general counsel and one director of 30 public affairs and consumer protection in the office of the state corporation 31 commission:

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(z) specifically designated by law as being in the unclassified service;

33 (aa) any position that is classified as a position in the information 34 resource manager job class series, that is the chief position responsible for 35 all information resources management for a state agency, and that becomes 36 vacant on or after the effective date of this act. Nothing in this section shall 37 affect the classified status of any employee in the classified service who is 38 employed on the date immediately preceding the effective date of this act in any position that is a classified position in the information resource 39 40 manager job class series and the unclassified status as prescribed by this 41 subsection shall apply only to a person appointed to any such position on 42 or after the effective date of this act that is the chief position responsible 43 for all information resources management for a state agency;

1 (bb) positions at state institutions of higher education that have been 2 converted to unclassified positions pursuant to K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 76-3 715a, and amendments thereto; and

16 (2) The classified service comprises all positions now existing or 17 hereafter created which are not included in the unclassified service. 18 Appointments in the classified service shall be made according to merit 19 and fitness from eligible pools which so far as practicable shall be competitive. No person shall be appointed, promoted, reduced or 20 21 discharged as an officer, clerk, employee or laborer in the classified 22 service in any manner or by any means other than those prescribed in the 23 Kansas civil service act and the rules adopted in accordance therewith.

24 (3) For positions involving unskilled, or semiskilled duties, the 25 secretary of administration, as provided by law, shall establish rules and certifications. 26 regulations concerning appointments. lavoffs and 27 reemployment which may be different from the rules and regulations 28 established concerning these processes for other positions in the classified 29 service.

(4) Officers authorized by law to make appointments to positions in the unclassified service, and appointing officers of departments or institutions whose employees are exempt from the provisions of the Kansas civil service act because of the constitutional status of such departments or institutions shall be permitted to make appointments from appropriate pools of eligibles maintained by the division of personnel services.

(5) On and after-the effective date of this act July 1, 2015, any state agency that has positions in the classified service within the Kansas civil service act to satisfy any requirement of maintaining personnel standards on a merit basis pursuant to federal law or the rules and regulations promulgated thereunder by the federal government or any agency thereof, shall adopt a binding statement of agency policy pursuant to K.S.A. 77-415, and amendments thereto, to satisfy such requirements if the

- 1 appointing authority has made any such position unclassified.
- 2 (6) On and after January 1, 2017, if a state employee in the classified
- 3 service voluntarily transfers into, or is voluntarily promoted or demoted
- 4 into a position in the unclassified service, such employee shall not be
- 5 eligible to be rehired or transferred to a position in the classified service
- 6 within the same state agency.
