1 AN ACT making and concerning appropriations for the fiscal years ending
2 June 30, 2018, June 30, 2019, June 30, 2020, June 30, 2021, June 30,
3 2022, June 30, 2023, and June 30, 2024, for state agencies; authorizing
4 and directing payment of certain claims against the state; authorizing
5 certain transfers, capital improvement projects and fees, imposing
6 certain restrictions and limitations, and directing or authorizing certain
7 receipts, disbursements, procedures and acts incidental to the
8 foregoing; amending K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 74-4920, 75-2263, 75-4209,
9 75-6706, 79-4804 and 82a-953a and repealing the existing sections.

11 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

12 Section 1. (a) For the fiscal years ending June 30, 2018, and June 30,
13 2019, June 30, 2020, June 30, 2021, June 30, 2022, June 30, 2023, and
14 June 30, 2024, appropriations are hereby made, restrictions and limitations
15 are hereby imposed, and transfers, capital improvement projects, fees,
16 receipts, disbursements, procedures and acts incidental to the foregoing are
17 hereby directed or authorized as provided in this act.

18 (b) The agencies named in this act are hereby authorized to initiate
19 and complete the capital improvement projects specified and authorized by
20 this act or for which appropriations are made by this act, subject to the
21 restrictions and limitations imposed by this act.

22 (c) This act shall be known and may be cited as the omnibus
23 appropriation act of 2018 and shall constitute the omnibus reconciliation
24 spending limit bill for the 2018 regular session of the legislature for
25 purposes of K.S.A. 75-6702(a), and amendments thereto.

26 (d) The appropriations made by this act shall not be subject to the
27 provisions of K.S.A. 46-155, and amendments thereto.
