AN ACT concerning alcoholic beverages; relating to the hours of sale-of 1 alcoholic liquor by the drink; farm winery outlet sales for 2 consumption; amending K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 41-308a, 41-308b, 41-354, 3 4 41-2614 and 41-2640 and repealing the existing sections. 5 6 *Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:* 7 Section 1. K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 41-308a is hereby amended to read as 8 follows: 41-308a. (a) A farm winery license shall allow: 9 (1) The manufacture of domestic table wine and domestic fortified wine in a quantity not exceeding 100,000 gallons per year and the 10 11 storage thereof; 12 (2) the sale of wine, manufactured by the licensee, to licensed wine 13 distributors, retailers, public venues, clubs, drinking establishments, holders of temporary permits as authorized by K.S.A. 41-2645, and 14 amendments thereto, and caterers; 15 (3) the sale, on the licensed premises and at special events 16 monitored and regulated by the division of alcoholic beverage control in 17 18 the original unopened container to consumers for consumption off the 19 licensed premises, of wine manufactured by the licensee; 20 (4) the serving free of charge on the licensed premises and at 21 special events, monitored and regulated by the division of alcoholic 22 beverage control, of samples of wine manufactured by the licensee or 23 imported under subsection (e), if the licensed premises are located in a 24 county where the sale of alcoholic liquor is permitted by law in licensed 25 drinking establishments; 26 (5) the sale of wine manufactured by the licensee for consumption 27 on the licensed premises, provided, the licensed premises are located in a county where the sale of alcoholic liquor is permitted by law in licensed 28 drinking establishments. Wine sold pursuant to this paragraph shall not 29 be subject to the provisions of the club and drinking establishment act, 30 K.S.A. 41-2601 et seq., and amendments thereto, and no drinking 31 establishment license shall be required to make such sales; 32 (6) if the licensee is also licensed as a club or drinking 33 34 establishment, the sale of domestic wine, domestic fortified wine and 35 other alcoholic liquor for consumption on the licensed premises as authorized by the club and drinking establishment act; 36

1 (7) if the licensee is also licensed as a caterer, the sale of domestic 2 wine, domestic fortified wine and other alcoholic liquor for consumption 3 on the unlicensed premises as authorized by the club and drinking 4 establishment act;

5 (8) the sale and shipping, in the original unopened container, to 6 consumers outside this state of wine manufactured by the licensee, 7 provided that the licensee complies with applicable laws and rules and 8 regulations of the jurisdiction to which the wine is shipped; and

9 (9) the sale and shipping of wine within this state pursuant to a 10 permit issued pursuant to K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 41-350, and amendments 11 thereto.

(b) Upon application and payment of the fee prescribed by K.S.A.
41-310, and amendments thereto, by a farm winery licensee, the director
may issue not to exceed three winery outlet licenses to the farm winery
licensee. A winery outlet license shall allow:

16 (1) The sale, on the licensed premises and at special events monitored and regulated by the division of alcoholic beverage control in 17 the original unopened container to consumers for consumption off the 18 19 licensed premises, of wine manufactured by the licensee, and the sale of wine manufactured by the licensee for consumption on the licensed 20 21 premises, provided, the licensed premises are located in a county where 22 the sale of alcoholic liquor is permitted by law in licensed drinking 23 establishments. Wine sold pursuant to this paragraph shall not be subject to the provisions of the club and drinking establishment act, K.S.A. 41-24 25 2601 et seq., and amendments thereto, and no drinking establishment license shall be required to make the sale: 26

(2) the serving on the licensed premises of samples of wine
manufactured by the licensee or imported under subsection (e), if the
premises are located in a county where the sale of alcoholic liquor is
permitted by law in licensed drinking establishments; and

(3) the manufacture of domestic table wine and domestic fortified
wine and the storage thereof; provided, that the aggregate quantity of
wine produced by the farm winery licensee, including all winery outlets,
shall not exceed 100,000 gallons per year.

(c) Not less than 30% of the products utilized in the manufacture of domestic table wine and domestic fortified wine by a farm winery shall be grown in Kansas except when a lesser proportion is authorized by the director based upon the director's findings and judgment. The production requirement of this subsection shall be determined based on the annual production of domestic table wine and domestic fortified wine by the farm winery.

42 (d) A farm winery or winery outlet may sell domestic wine and 43 domestic fortified wine in the original unopened container to consumers 1 for consumption off the licensed premises at any time between 6 a.m.

and 12 midnight on any day-except Sunday and between 12 noon and 6 2 p.m. on Sunday. If authorized by subsection (a), a farm winery may serve 3 samples of wine manufactured by the licensee and wine imported under 4 5 subsection (e) and serve and sell domestic wine, domestic fortified wine and other alcoholic liquor for consumption on the licensed premises at 6 7 any time when a club or drinking establishment is authorized to serve and sell alcoholic liquor. If authorized by subsection (b), a winery outlet 8 may serve samples of domestic wine, domestic fortified wine and wine 9 imported under subsection (e) at any time when the winery outlet is 10 authorized to sell domestic wine and domestic fortified wine. 11

The director may issue to the Kansas state fair or any bona fide 12 (e) group of grape growers or wine makers a permit to import into this state 13 small quantities of wines. Such wine shall be used only for bona fide 14 educational and scientific tasting programs and shall not be resold. 15 16 Such wine shall not be subject to the tax imposed by K.S.A. 41-501, and amendments thereto. The permit shall identify specifically the brand and 17 18 type of wine to be imported, the quantity to be imported, the tasting 19 programs for which the wine is to be used and the times and locations of such programs. The secretary shall adopt rules and regulations 20 21 governing the importation of wine pursuant to this subsection and the 22 conduct of tasting programs for which such wine is imported.

(f) A farm winery license or winery outlet license shall apply only to
 the premises described in the application and in the license issued and
 only one location shall be described in the license.

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(g) No farm winery or winery outlet shall:

(1) Employ any person under the age of 18 years in connection with
 the manufacture, sale or serving of any alcoholic liquor;

29 (2) permit any employee of the licensee who is under the age of 21
30 years to work on the licensed premises at any time when not under the
31 on-premise supervision of either the licensee or an employee of the
32 licensee who is 21 years of age or over;

(3) employ any person under 21 years of age in connection with
 mixing or dispensing alcoholic liquor; or

(4) employ any person in connection with the manufacture or sale
 of alcoholic liquor if the person has been convicted of a felony.

(h) Whenever a farm winery or winery outlet licensee is convicted
of a violation of the Kansas liquor control act, the director may revoke
the licensee's license and order forfeiture of all fees paid for the license,
after a hearing before the director for that purpose in accordance with
the provisions of the Kansas administrative procedure act.

42 *(i)* This section shall be part of and supplemental to the Kansas 43 liquor control act. 1 Sec. 2. K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 41-308b is hereby amended to read as 2 follows: 41-308b. (a) A microbrewery license shall allow:

3 (1) The manufacture of not less than 100 nor more than 60,000 4 barrels of domestic beer during the calendar year and the storage 5 thereof, if, however, the licensee holds a 10% or greater ownership 6 interest in one or more entities that also hold a microbrewery license, 7 then the aggregate number of barrels of domestic beer manufactured by 8 all such licensees with such common ownership shall not exceed the 9 60,000 barrel limit;

10 (2) the manufacture in the aggregate of not more than 100,000 11 gallons of hard cider during the calendar year and the storage thereof;

12 (3) the sale to beer distributors of beer and the sale to wine 13 distributors of hard cider, manufactured by the licensee;

(4) the sale, on the licensed premises in the original unopened
 container to consumers for consumption off the licensed premises, of
 beer and hard cider manufactured by the licensee;

17 (5) the serving free of charge on the licensed premises and at 18 special events, monitored and regulated by the division of alcoholic 19 beverage control, of samples of beer and hard cider manufactured by the 20 licensee, if the premises are located in a county where the sale of 21 alcoholic liquor is permitted by law in licensed drinking establishments;

22 (6) if the premises is also licensed as a club or drinking 23 establishment, the sale and transfer of domestic beer to such club or 24 drinking establishment and the sale of domestic beer and other alcoholic 25 liquor for consumption on the licensed premises as authorized by the 26 club and drinking establishment act;

(7) if the premises is also licensed as a caterer, the sale of domestic
beer and other alcoholic liquor for consumption on unlicensed premises
as authorized by the club and drinking establishment act; and

(8) if the licensee holds a 10% or greater ownership interest in one
or more entities that also hold a microbrewery license, the domestic beer
may be manufactured and transferred for sale or storage among such
microbrewery licensees with such common ownership.

(b) Not less than 30% of the products utilized in the manufacture of
hard cider by a microbrewery shall be grown in Kansas except when a
lesser proportion is authorized by the director based upon the director's
findings and judgment. The production requirement of this subsection
shall be determined based on the annual production of domestic hard
cider.

40 (c) Upon application and payment of the fee prescribed by K.S.A. 41 41-310, and amendments thereto, by a microbrewery licensee, the 42 director may issue not to exceed one microbrewery packaging and 43 warehousing facility license to the microbrewery licensee. A 1 microbrewery packaging and warehousing facility license shall allow:

2 (1) The transfer, from the licensed premises of the microbrewery to 3 the licensed premises of the microbrewery packaging and warehousing 4 facility, of beer and hard cider manufactured by the licensee, for the 5 purpose of packaging or storage, or both;

6 (2) the transfer, from the licensed premises of the microbrewery 7 packaging and warehousing facility to the licensed premises of any 8 microbrewery of such licensee, of beer manufactured by the licensee;

9 (3) the removal from the licensed premises of the microbrewery 10 packaging and warehousing facility of beer manufactured by the 11 licensee for the purpose of delivery to a licensed beer wholesaler; and

12 (4) the removal from the licensed premises of the microbrewery 13 packaging and warehousing facility of hard cider manufactured by the 14 licensee for the purpose of delivery to a licensed wine distributor.

(d) A microbrewery may sell domestic beer in the original unopened 15 16 container to consumers for consumption off the licensed premises at any time between 6 a.m. and 12 midnight on any day-except Sunday and 17 18 between 11 a.m. and 7 p.m. on Sunday. If authorized by subsection (a), a microbrewery may serve samples of domestic beer and serve and sell 19 domestic beer and other alcoholic liquor for consumption on the 20 21 licensed premises at any time when a club or drinking establishment is 22 authorized to serve and sell alcoholic liquor.

23 (e) The director may issue to the Kansas state fair or any bona fide group of brewers a permit to import into this state small quantities of 24 25 beer. Such beer shall be used only for bona fide educational and scientific tasting programs and shall not be resold. Such beer shall not 26 be subject to the tax imposed by K.S.A. 41-501, and amendments thereto. 27 The permit shall identify specifically the brand and type of beer to be 28 29 imported, the quantity to be imported, the tasting programs for which the beer is to be used and the times and locations of such programs. The 30 secretary shall adopt rules and regulations governing the importation of 31 32 beer pursuant to this subsection and the conduct of tasting programs for 33 which such beer is imported.

(f) A microbrewery license or microbrewery packaging and
warehousing facility license shall apply only to the premises described in
the application and in the license issued and only one location shall be
described in the license.

(g) No microbrewery shall:

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Employ any person under the age of 18 years in connection with the manufacture, sale or serving of any alcoholic liquor;

41 (2) permit any employee of the licensee who is under the age of 21 42 years to work on the licensed premises at any time when not under the 43 on-premises supervision of either the licensee or an employee of the 1 licensee who is 21 years of age or over;

2 (3) employ any person under 21 years of age in connection with 3 mixing or dispensing alcoholic liquor; or

4 (4) employ any person in connection with the manufacture or sale 5 of alcoholic liquor if the person has been convicted of a felony.

6 (h) Whenever a microbrewery licensee is convicted of a violation of 7 the Kansas liquor control act, the director may revoke the licensee's 8 license and all fees paid for the license in accordance with the Kansas 9 administrative procedure act.

10 Sec. 3. K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 41-354 is hereby amended to read as 11 follows: 41-354. (a) A microdistillery license shall allow:

12 (1) The manufacture of not more than 50,000 gallons of spirits per 13 year and the storage thereof;

14 (2) the sale to spirit distributors of spirits, manufactured by the 15 licensee;

16 (3) the sale, on the licensed premises in the original unopened 17 container to consumers for consumption off the licensed premises, of 18 spirits manufactured by the licensee;

(4) the serving free of charge on the licensed premises and at
special events, monitored and regulated by the division of alcoholic
beverage control, of samples of spirits manufactured by the licensee, if
the premises are located in a county where the sale of alcoholic liquor is
permitted by law in licensed drinking establishments;

(5) if the licensee is also licensed as a club or drinking
establishment, the sale of spirits and other alcoholic liquor for
consumption on the licensed premises as authorized by the club and
drinking establishment act; and

(6) if the licensee is also licensed as a caterer, the sale of spirits and
 other alcoholic liquor for consumption on unlicensed premises as
 authorized by the club and drinking establishment act.

(b) Upon application and payment of the fee prescribed by K.S.A.
 41-310, and amendments thereto, by a microdistillery licensee, the
 director may issue not to exceed one microdistillery packaging and
 warehousing facility license to the microdistillery licensee. A
 microdistillery packaging and warehousing facility license shall allow:

(1) The transfer, from the licensed premises of the microdistillery to
 the licensed premises of the microdistillery packaging and warehousing
 facility, of spirits manufactured by the licensee, for the purpose of
 packaging or storage, or both;

40 (2) the transfer, from the licensed premises of the microdistillery 41 packaging and warehousing facility to the licensed premises of the 42 microdistillery, of spirits manufactured by the licensee; or

43 (3) the removal from the licensed premises of the microdistillery

1 packaging and warehousing facility of spirits manufactured by the 2 licensee for the purpose of delivery to a licensed spirits wholesaler.

(c) A microdistillery may sell spirits in the original unopened 3 4 container to consumers for consumption off the licensed premises at any 5 time between 6 a.m. and 12 midnight on any day-except Sunday and between 11 a.m. and 7 p.m. on Sunday. If authorized by subsection (a), a 6 7 microdistillery may serve samples of spirits and serve and sell spirits and other alcoholic liquor for consumption on the licensed premises at any 8 time when a club or drinking establishment is authorized to serve and 9 10 sell alcoholic liquor.

(d) The director may issue to the Kansas state fair or any bona fide 11 group of distillers a permit to import into this state small quantities of 12 spirits. Such spirits shall be used only for bona fide educational and 13 scientific tasting programs and shall not be resold. Such spirits shall not 14 be subject to the tax imposed by K.S.A. 41-501, and amendments thereto. 15 16 The permit shall identify specifically the brand and type of spirit to be imported, the quantity to be imported, the tasting programs for which the 17 18 spirit is to be used and the times and locations of such programs. The 19 secretary shall adopt rules and regulations governing the importation of 20 spirits pursuant to this subsection and the conduct of tasting programs 21 for which such spirits are imported.

(e) A microdistillery license or microdistillery packaging and
 warehousing facility license shall apply only to the premises described in
 the application and in the license issued and only one location shall be
 described in the license.

(f) No microdistillery shall:

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27 (1) Employ any person under the age of 18 years in connection with
 28 the manufacture, sale or serving of any alcoholic liquor;

(2) permit any employee of the licensee who is under the age of 21
years to work on the licensed premises at any time when not under the
on-premises supervision of either the licensee or an employee of the
licensee who is 21 years of age or over;

(3) employ any person under 21 years of age in connection with
 mixing or dispensing alcoholic liquor; or

35 (4) employ any person in connection with the manufacture or sale 36 of alcoholic liquor if the person has been convicted of a felony.

(g) Whenever a microdistillery licensee is convicted of a violation of
the Kansas liquor control act, the director may revoke the licensee's
license and all fees paid for the license in accordance with the Kansas
administrative procedure act.

41 (h) The provisions of this section shall take effect and be in force 42 from and after July 1, 2012.

43 (i) All rules and regulations adopted on and after July 1, 2012, and

1 prior to July 1, 2013, to implement this section shall continue to be 2 effective and shall be deemed to be duly adopted rules and regulations of 3 the secretary until revised, amended, revoked or nullified pursuant to 4 law.

5 (j) This section shall be a part of and supplemental to the Kansas 6 liquor control act.

Section 1: Sec. 4. K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 41-2614 is hereby amended to
read as follows: 41-2614. (a) Except as provided by subsection (c), no
public venue, club or drinking establishment shall allow the serving,
mixing or consumption of alcoholic liquor on its premises between the
hours of 2:00 a.m. and 9:00 6:00 a.m. on any day.

(b) No caterer shall allow the serving, mixing or consumption of
alcoholic liquor between the hours of 2:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. on any day
at an event catered by such caterer.

(c) A hotel of which the entire premises are licensed as a drinking
establishment or as a drinking establishment/caterer may allow at any time
the serving, mixing and consumption of alcoholic liquor and cereal malt
beverage from a minibar in a guest room by guests registered to stay in
such room, and guests of guests registered to stay in such room.

Sec. 2. 5. K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 41-2640 is hereby amended to read as
 follows: 41-2640. (a) No club, drinking establishment, caterer or holder of
 a temporary permit, nor any person acting as an employee or agent thereof,
 shall:

24 (1) Offer or serve any free cereal malt beverage or alcoholic liquor in25 any form to any person;

26 (2) offer or serve to any person an individual drink at a price that is
27 less than the acquisition cost of the individual drink to the licensee or
28 permit holder;

(3) sell, offer to sell or serve to any person an unlimited number of
individual drinks during any set period of time for a fixed price, except at
private functions not open to the general public or to the general
membership of a club;

(4) encourage or permit, on the licensed premises, any game or
 contest which involves drinking alcoholic liquor or cereal malt beverage or
 the awarding of individual drinks as prizes;

(5) sell, offer to sell or serve free of charge any form of powdered
alcohol, as defined in K.S.A. 41-102, and amendments thereto; or

(6) advertise or promote in any way, whether on or off the licensed
premises, any of the practices prohibited under subsections (a)(1) through
(5).

41 (b) No public venue, nor any person acting as an employee or agent 42 thereof, shall:

43 (1) Offer or serve any free cereal malt beverage or alcoholic liquor in

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1 any form to any person;

2 (2) offer or serve to any person a drink or original container of 3 alcoholic liquor or cereal malt beverage at a price that is less than the 4 acquisition cost of the drink or original container of alcoholic liquor or 5 cereal malt beverage to the licensee;

6 (3) sell or serve alcoholic liquor in glass containers to customers in 7 the general admission area;

8 (4) sell or serve more than two drinks per customer at any one time in 9 the general admission area;

(5) encourage or permit, on the licensed premises, any game or
 contest which involves drinking alcoholic liquor or cereal malt beverage or
 the awarding of drinks as prizes;

(6) sell, offer to sell or serve free of charge any form of powderedalcohol, as defined in K.S.A. 41-102, and amendments thereto; or

(7) advertise or promote in any way, whether on or off the licensed
 premises, any of the practices prohibited under subsections (b)(1) through
 (6).

(c) A public venue, club, drinking establishment, caterer or holder ofa temporary permit may:

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(1) Offer free food or entertainment at any time;

(2) sell or deliver wine by the bottle or carafe;

(3) sell, offer to sell and serve individual drinks at different pricesthroughout any day;

(4) sell or serve beer or cereal malt beverage in a pitcher capable ofcontaining not more than 64 fluid ounces;

26 (5) offer samples of alcohol liquor free of charge as authorized by this27 act; or

(6) sell or serve margarita, sangria, daiquiri, mojito or other mixed
 alcoholic beverages as approved by the director in a pitcher containing not
 more than 64 fluid ounces.

31 (d) A hotel of which the entire premises is licensed as a drinking establishment may, in accordance with rules and regulations adopted by 32 the secretary, distribute to its guests coupons redeemable on the hotel 33 premises for drinks containing alcoholic liquor. The hotel shall remit 34 liquor drink tax in accordance with the provisions of the liquor drink tax 35 act, K.S.A. 79-41a01 et seq., and amendments thereto, on each drink 36 37 served based on a price which is not less than the acquisition cost of the 38 drink

(e) (1) A public venue, club or drinking establishment may offer
customer self-service of wine from automated devices on licensed
premises so long as the licensee monitors and has the ability to control the
dispensing of such wine from the automated devices.

43 (2) The secretary may adopt rules and regulations as necessary to

1 implement the provisions of this subsection.

2 (f) A hotel of which the entire premises is not licensed as a drinking establishment may, in accordance with rules and regulations adopted by 3 the secretary, through an agreement with one or more clubs or drinking 4 5 establishments, distribute to its guests coupons redeemable at such clubs or 6 drinking establishments for drinks containing alcoholic liquor. Each club 7 or drinking establishment redeeming coupons issued by a hotel shall 8 collect from the hotel the agreed price, which shall be not less than the acquisition cost of the drink plus the liquor drink tax for each drink served. 9 The club or drinking establishment shall collect and remit the liquor drink 10 tax in accordance with the provisions of the liquor drink tax act, K.S.A. 11 12 79-41a01 et seq., and amendments thereto.

(g) Violation of any provision of this section is a misdemeanorpunishable as provided by K.S.A. 41-2633, and amendments thereto.

(h) Violation of any provision of this section shall be grounds for
suspension or revocation of the licensee's license as provided by K.S.A.
41-2609, and amendments thereto, and for imposition of a civil fine on the
licensee or temporary permit holder as provided by K.S.A. 41-2633a, and
amendments thereto.

(i) For purposes of this section, the term "day" means from 6:00 a.m.
until 2:00 a.m. the following calendar day.
