AN ACT concerning medical student and resident loan assistance; relating 1 2 to medical student loan agreements; practice commitment agreements; 3 providing for agreements for the practice of psychiatry; *establishing* 4 the psychiatry medical loan repayment fund and the rural health 5 bridging psychiatry fund; {concerning mental healthcare facilities;} amending K.S.A. 76-387 {and 76-12a07} and K.S.A. 2016 Supp. {75-6 7 3373.} 76-381, 76-382, 76-383-and, 76-384 and 76-385 and repealing 8 the existing sections.

10 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

11 Section 1. K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 76-381 is hereby amended to read as 12 follows: 76-381. As used in K.S.A. 76-380 through 76-386, and 13 amendments thereto:

(a) "Act" means the medical student loan act;

(b) "approved postgraduate residency training program" means a
residency training program in general pediatrics, general internal
medicine, family medicine, family practice, emergency medicine, *general psychiatry, child psychiatry* or fellowship training in geriatric medicine;

19 "service commitment area" means: (1) Any community within any (c)20 county in Kansas other than Douglas, Johnson, Sedgwick, Shawnee or 21 Wyandotte county; (2) any state medical care facility or institution; (3) any 22 medical center operated by the veterans administration of the United 23 States; (4) the full-time faculty of the university of Kansas school of 24 medicine in family medicine-or, family practice, general psychiatry or 25 child psychiatry; or (5) any community within Wyandotte county for 26 purposes of any practice obligation under an agreement entered into by a 27 person who is enrolled for the first time after July 1, 2004, in a course of 28 study leading to the medical degree; and

(d) "state medical care facility or institution" includes, but is not limited to, the Kansas state school for the visually handicapped, the Kansas state school for the deaf, any institution under the secretary for aging and disability services, as defined by-subsection (b) of K.S.A. 76-12a01, and amendments thereto, any institution under the commissioner of juvenile justice as defined by K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 38-2302, and amendments thereto, the Kansas soldiers' home, the Kansas veterans' home
 and any correctional institution under the secretary of corrections, as
 defined by-subsection (d) of K.S.A. 75-5202, and amendments thereto, but
 shall not include any state educational institution under the state board of
 regents, as defined by-subsection (a) of K.S.A. 76-711, and amendments
 thereto, except as specifically provided by statute.

Sec. 2. K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 76-382 is hereby amended to read as
follows: 76-382. (a) There is hereby established the medical student loan
program at the university of Kansas school of medicine.

(b) Subject to the provisions of appropriation acts, the university of 10 Kansas school of medicine may make medical student loans in 11 accordance with the provisions of this act to undergraduate students 12 enrolled in or admitted to the university of Kansas school of medicine in 13 a course of instruction leading to the degree of doctor of medicine who 14 15 enter into a written medical student loan agreement with the university 16 of Kansas school of medicine in accordance with K.S.A. 76-383, and 17 amendments thereto.

18 (c) Each medical student loan agreement under this act shall 19 provide to the person receiving the loan the payment of all tuition and a 20 stipend for living expenses in an amount of up to \$2,000 per month for 21 each month enrolled in such school during a year. Subject to the 22 maximum amount, the amount of the monthly stipend shall be 23 determined on an annual basis by the student receiving the loan.

24 (d) Subject to the provisions of appropriation acts, medical student 25 loan agreements under this act may be entered into on an annual basis and shall provide the payment of the amounts specified under subsection 26 27 (c) for one year unless otherwise terminated before such period of time. Subject to the provisions of appropriation acts, an undergraduate 28 student enrolled in or admitted to the university of Kansas school of 29 medicine in a course of instruction leading to the degree of doctor of 30 31 medicine may receive a separate loan under this act for each separate 32 year the student enters into a written medical student loan agreement 33 with the university of Kansas school of medicine in accordance with 34 K.S.A. 76-383, and amendments thereto. Loans may be awarded retroactively for any academic year that a student has completed 35 36 successfully at the university of Kansas medical school, but for which a 37 loan had not previously been awarded. Retroactive loans shall be in an 38 amount equal to the amount of tuition paid by the student, plus a stipend 39 in an amount not to exceed the maximum amount of the stipend for such academic year multiplied by the number of months for which the 40 41 student was enrolled at the medical school during such year. For each 42 separate year a student receives a loan under this act, the student shall 43 engage in the full-time practice of medicine and surgery in an

1 appropriate service commitment area for a period of 12 months unless

2 such obligation is otherwise satisfied as provided in K.S.A. 76-386, and
3 amendments thereto.

4 (e) Medical student loans shall be awarded on a priority basis as 5 follows, first to qualified applicants who are Kansas residents at the time 6 of entry into the university of Kansas school of medicine, and second, to 7 qualified applicants who are not Kansas residents at the time of entry 8 into the university of Kansas school of medicine. As used in this 9 subsection, "Kansas residents" means persons who meet the residence 10 requirements established in K.S.A. 76-729, and amendments thereto.

(f) Subject to appropriations, the university of Kansas school of 11 medicine shall enter into medical student loan agreements with six 12 13 individuals who commit to satisfy obligations to engage in the full-time practice of medicine and surgery in a service commitment area by: (1) 14 15 Serving as a full-time faculty member of the university of Kansas school of 16 medicine in general psychiatry or child psychiatry pursuant to K.S.A. 76-17 384(c), and amendments thereto; or (2) performing at least 100 hours per month of on-site mental health care pursuant to K.S.A. 76-384(d), and 18 19 amendments thereto.

Sec.-2: 3. K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 76-383 is hereby amended to read as follows: 76-383. A medical student loan agreement entered into by the university of Kansas school of medicine and an undergraduate student enrolled in or admitted to the university of Kansas school of medicine in a course of instruction leading to the degree of doctor of medicine for the purpose of receiving a medical student loan under this act shall require that the person receiving the loan:

(a) Complete the required course of instruction and receive the degree
 of doctor of medicine and apply for, enter and complete an approved
 postgraduate residency training program;

30 (b) apply for and obtain a license to practice medicine and surgery in31 Kansas;

(c) engage in the full-time practice of medicine and surgery for a
period of 12 months within a service commitment area, except as
otherwise provided in subsection (c) of K.S.A. 76-384(c), and amendments
thereto, for service as a full-time faculty member of the university of
Kansas school of medicine in family medicine-or, family practice, general *psychiatry or child psychiatry*;

(d) commence such full-time practice of medicine and surgery within
nine months after completion of an approved postgraduate residency
training program and licensure in a service commitment area and continue
such full-time practice in such service commitment area for a consecutive
period of months equal to the total number of months required under the
agreement;

1 (e) agree that the service commitment for each agreement entered into 2 under this act is in addition to the service commitment contained in any 3 other agreement which has been or may be entered into under this act for 4 the purpose of obtaining a medical student loan or under other agreements 5 for the purpose of obtaining scholarship aid;

6 (f) maintain records and make reports to the university of Kansas 7 school of medicine to document the satisfaction of the obligation under 8 such agreement to engage in the full-time practice of medicine and surgery 9 within a service commitment area and to continue such full-time practice 10 in such service commitment area for a consecutive period of months equal 11 to the total number of months required under the agreement; and

(g) upon failure to satisfy an agreement to engage in the full-time practice of medicine and surgery within a service commitment area for the required period of time under any such agreement, the person receiving a medical student loan under this act shall repay amounts to the university of Kansas school of medicine as provided in K.S.A. 76-385, and amendments thereto.

18 Sec. -3. 4. K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 76-384 is hereby amended to read as 19 follows: 76-384. (a) Upon the selection of a service commitment area for 20 the purposes of satisfying a service obligation under a medical student loan 21 agreement entered into under this act, the person so selecting shall inform 22 the university of Kansas school of medicine of the service commitment 23 area selected.

24 (b) A person serving in a service commitment area pursuant to any 25 agreement under this act may serve all or part of any commitment in the service commitment area initially selected by such person. If such person 26 27 moves from one service commitment area to another service commitment 28 area, such person shall notify the university of Kansas school of medicine 29 of such person's change of service commitment area. Service in any such 30 service commitment area shall be deemed to be continuous for the purpose 31 of satisfying any agreement entered into under this act.

32 (c) A person receiving a medical student loan under this act, may 33 satisfy the obligation to engage in the full-time practice of medicine and 34 surgery in a service commitment area if the person serves as a full-time 35 faculty member of the university of Kansas school of medicine in general 36 internal medicine, general pediatrics, family medicine-or, family practice, 37 general psychiatry or child psychiatry and serves two years for each one 38 year of such obligation, or the equivalent thereof on a two-for-one basis, 39 except that, at the time any person commences satisfying such service 40 obligation as a full-time faculty member pursuant to this subsection, the 41 number of persons satisfying service commitments or service obligations, 42 pursuant to agreements under the medical student loan act, as full-time 43 faculty members pursuant to this subsection shall not exceed the number

equal to 25% of the total number of full-time faculty members of the
 university of Kansas school of medicine in general internal medicine,
 general pediatrics, family medicine-or, family practice, *general psychiatry* or child psychiatry.

5 (d) A person may satisfy the obligation to engage in the full-time 6 practice of medicine and surgery in a service commitment area by 7 performing at least 100 hours per month of on-site primary care or mental health care at a medical facility-or community mental health center-8 9 operated by a local health department-or mental health department or nonprofit organization in this state serving medically indigent persons or 10 at a community mental health center {or at Larned state hospital, 11 12 Osawatomie state hospital or any facility that provides mental health services and that is operated by a state agency?. As used in this 13 subsection, "medically indigent" means a person: (1) Who is unable to 14 15 secure health care because of inability to pay for all or a part of the costs 16 thereof due to inadequate personal resources, being uninsured, being 17 underinsured, being ineligible for governmental health benefits; or (2) who 18 is eligible for governmental benefits but is unable to obtain medical 19 services; and "primary care" means general pediatrics, general internal 20 medicine, family medicine and family practice.

21 Sec. 5. K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 76-385 is hereby amended to read as 22 follows: 76-385. (a) (1) Except as otherwise provided in paragraphs (2), 23 (3), (4) and (5) of this subsection (a) or in K.S.A. 76-386, and amendments thereto, upon the failure of any person to satisfy the 24 obligation to engage in the full-time practice of medicine and surgery 25 26 within a service commitment area of this state for the required period of 27 time under any medical student loan agreement entered into under this 28 act, such person shall repay to the university of Kansas school of 29 medicine in accordance with subsection (b) an amount equal to the total 30 of: (A) The amount of money received by such person pursuant to such agreement, or the amount of money determined under rules and 31 32 regulations of the university of Kansas; plus (B) annual interest at a rate 33 of 15% from the date such money was received.

34 (2) Any person who fails to apply for and enter an approved postgraduate residency training program shall be required to repay all 35 36 moneys received pursuant to an agreement entered into for any such 37 medical student loan, plus accumulated interest at an annual rate of 38 15% and shall commence such repayment in accordance with subsection 39 (b) within 90 days of graduation from the school of medicine or upon termination or completion of a residency training program which does 40 41 not comply with the provisions of this act, whichever is later.

42 (3) If at any time a person is failing to satisfy an obligation to 43 engage in the full-time practice of medicine and surgery in Kansas for 1 the required period of time under an agreement entered into under this 2 act because such person is engaged in the full-time practice of medicine 3 and surgery in a state other than Kansas, or within Kansas in an area 4 that is not a service commitment area or in the practice of medicine and 5 surgery which does not otherwise comply with the agreement entered 6 into under this act, and if such person is subject to or currently making

7 repayments under this section and if such person subsequently commences the practice of medicine and surgery in this state which is in 8 a service commitment area or which otherwise complies with the 9 agreement entered into under this act, the balance of the repayment 10 amount, including interest thereon, from the time of such 11 commencement of practice until the obligation of such person is 12 satisfied, or until the time such person again becomes subject to 13 repayments, shall be waived. All repayment amounts due prior to such 14 commencement of practice, including interest thereon, shall continue to 15 16 be payable as provided in this section. If subsequent to such commencement of practice, the person fails to satisfy such obligation, 17 the person again shall be subject to repayments, including interest 18 19 thereon, as otherwise provided in this section.

(4) If, during the time a person is satisfying the service requirement 20 21 of an agreement entered into under this act, such person desires to engage in less than the full-time practice of medicine and surgery within 22 23 a service commitment area of the state and remain in satisfaction of such service requirement, such person may make application to the 24 chancellor of the university of Kansas or the designee of the chancellor 25 for permission to engage in less than such full-time practice of medicine 26 and surgery. Upon a finding of exceptional circumstances made by the 27 chancellor of the university of Kansas, or the designee of the chancellor, 28 such person may be authorized to engage in less than the full-time 29 practice of medicine and surgery within a service commitment area of 30 the state for the remaining required period of time under such 31 agreement and for an additional period of time which shall be equal to 32 the length of the originally required period of time multiplied by the 33 decimal fraction which is equal to the reduction of the full-time practice 34 of medicine and surgery to be authorized hereunder, multiplied by two. 35 In any such determination of the period required to be engaged in the 36 37 less than full-time practice of medicine and surgery, the decimal fraction 38 utilized shall not exceed 0.5 and any person granted permission to 39 engage in less than the full-time practice of medicine and surgery in accordance with the provisions of this paragraph -(4) shall be required to 40 41 engage in at least the half-time practice of medicine and surgery.

42 (5) Any person who enters but fails to complete an approved 43 postgraduate residency training program, or who enters and completes 1 an approved postgraduate residency training program but fails to satisfy

the obligation to engage in the full-time practice of medicine and 2 surgery within a service commitment area of this state for the required 3 period of time shall be required to repay all money received pursuant to 4 an agreement entered into under this act a medical student loan, plus 5 6 accumulated interest at an annual rate of 15% and shall commence 7 such repayment in accordance with subsection (b) within 90 days of failure to complete an approved postgraduate residency training 8 program or 90 days of failure to commence qualifying practice, 9 10 whichever occurs first.

(b) For any repayment requirement under this section, the person
shall repay an amount totaling the entire amount to be repaid under all
such agreements for which such obligations are not satisfied, including
all amounts of interest at the rate prescribed. The repayment shall be
made in not more than 10 equal annual installment payments.

16 (c) All installment payments under this section shall commence six 17 months after the date of the action or circumstance that causes the 18 failure of the person to satisfy the obligations of such agreements, as 19 determined by the university of Kansas school of medicine based upon 20 the circumstances of each individual case. In all cases, if an installment 21 payment becomes 91 days overdue, the entire amount outstanding shall 22 become immediately due and payable, including all amounts of interest 23 at the rate prescribed.

24 (d) The total repayment obligation imposed under all agreements 25 entered into under this act may be satisfied by the person who entered into the agreements at any time prior to graduation from the university 26 of Kansas school of medicine by making a single lump-sum payment 27 28 equal to the total of: (1) The entire amount to be repaid under all such 29 agreements upon failure to satisfy the obligations under such agreements to practice in Kansas; plus (2) all amounts of interest 30 31 thereon at the rate prescribed to the date of payment.

(e) The university of Kansas school of medicine shall remit all moneys received under this section to the state treasurer in accordance with the provisions of K.S.A. 75-4215, and amendments thereto. Upon receipt of each such remittance, the state treasurer shall deposit the entire amount in the state treasury to the credit of the medical loan repayment fund.

(f) There is hereby created in the state treasury the medical loan repayment fund. All expenditures from the medical loan repayment fund shall be for medical student loans under the medical student loan act and for the expenses of administration of the medical student loan act and shall be made in accordance with appropriation acts upon warrants of the director of accounts and reports issued pursuant to vouchers 1 approved by the chancellor of the university of Kansas or by a person

designated by the chancellor, except that expenditures shall not be made 2 3 from the medical loan repayment fund for medical student loans for general psychiatry or child psychiatry. On the effective date of this act. 4 the director of accounts and reports shall transfer all moneys in the 5 6 medical scholarship and loan repayment fund to the medical loan 7 repayment fund. On the effective date of this act, all liabilities of the 8 medical scholarship and loan repayment fund are hereby imposed on the medical loan repayment fund and the medical scholarship and loan 9 repayment fund is hereby abolished. Whenever the medical scholarship 10 and loan repayment fund, or words of like effect, is referred to or 11 12 designated by any statute, contract or other document, such reference or designation shall be deemed to apply to the medical loan repayment 13 14 fund.

15 There is hereby established in the state treasury the psychiatry (g)16 medical loan repayment fund. All moneys credited to the psychiatry 17 medical loan repayment fund shall be expended only for medical student 18 loans for general psychiatry or child psychiatry students under the 19 medical student loan act and for the expenses of administration of the 20 medical student loan act associated with such students. All expenditures 21 from the psychiatry medical loan repayment fund shall be made in 22 accordance with appropriation acts upon warrants of the director of 23 accounts and reports issued pursuant to vouchers approved by the chancellor of the university of Kansas or the chancellor's designee. 24

25 {(h) Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, no 26 moneys shall be transferred from the comprehensive grant program 27 account of the state board of regents to the medical loan repayment fund 28 or the psychiatry medical loan repayment fund or expended for any 29 purposes related thereto.}

30 Sec.-4. 6. K.S.A. 76-387 is hereby amended to read as follows: 76-387. (a) There is hereby established the Kansas medical residency bridging 31 32 program at the university of Kansas school of medicine which shall be 33 developed and implemented in order to provide encouragement, opportunities and incentives for persons in primary care or mental health 34 35 care residency training programs in general pediatrics, general internal medicine, family medicine-or, family practice, which general psychiatry 36 37 or child psychiatry that are operated by or affiliated with the university of 38 Kansas school of medicine or other such primary care or mental health care residency training program-which that is operated in Kansas and 39 approved by the state board of healing arts and a person under subsection 40 41 (i) to locate their medical practice in rural Kansas communities upon completion of such residency training. The Kansas medical residency 42 43 bridging program shall be administered by the institute for rural health

1 care of the university of Kansas school of medicine.

2 (b) Subject to the provisions of appropriation acts, the university of 3 Kansas school of medicine may enter into residency bridging loan 4 agreements, in accordance with the provisions of this section.: (A) With 5 any person who has completed the first year of a primary care or mental 6 *health care* residency training program in general pediatrics, general 7 internal medicine, family medicine-or, family practice, which general 8 psychiatry or child psychiatry that is operated by or affiliated with the 9 university of Kansas school of medicine or other such primary care or 10 mental health care residency training program-which that is operated in Kansas and approved by the state board of healing arts; and (B) with a 11 12 person under subsection (i).

13 Subject to the provisions of appropriation acts, each person (c) entering into a residency bridging loan agreement under this section shall 14 receive a payment of \$5,000 each year of primary care or mental health 15 16 care residency training, or any part of a year of such training, after the date 17 that the residency bridging loan agreement is entered into by the resident 18 and the university of Kansas school of medicine and, upon completion of 19 the primary care or mental health care residency training program, a 20 payment of \$6,000.

21 (d) Each residency bridging loan agreement shall require that the 22 person receiving the loan:

(1) Complete the primary care *or mental health care* residencytraining program;

(2) engage in the full-time practice of medicine and surgery in any
 county in Kansas other than Douglas, Johnson, Sedgwick, Shawnee or
 Wyandotte for three years under a practice commitment agreement;

(3) commence such full-time practice of medicine and surgery within
 90 days after completing the primary care *or mental health care* residency
 training program; and

31 (4) upon failure to satisfy the obligation to engage in the full-time 32 practice of medicine and surgery in accordance with the provisions of the 33 residency bridging loan agreement and this section, the person receiving 34 the loan under this section shall repay to the university of Kansas school of 35 medicine, within 90 days of such failure, the amount equal to the amount 36 of money received by such person from the university of Kansas school of 37 medicine, less credits earned, under such agreement plus interest at the 38 annual rate of 15% from the date such money was received.

(e) An obligation to engage in the practice of medicine and surgery in
accordance with the provisions of a residency bridging loan agreement and
this section shall be postponed during: (1) Any period of temporary
medical disability during which the person obligated is unable to practice
medicine and surgery because of such medical disability₅; or (2) any other

1 period of postponement agreed to or determined in accordance with 2 criteria agreed to in the practice commitment agreement.

(f) An obligation to engage in the practice of medicine and surgery in accordance with the provisions of a residency bridging loan agreement and this section shall be satisfied: (1) If the obligation to engage in the practice of medicine and surgery in accordance with such agreement has been completed₅; (2) if the person obligated dies₅; or (3) if, because of permanent physical disability, the person obligated is unable to practice medicine and surgery.

10 (g) The university of Kansas school of medicine may adopt additional 11 provisions, requirements or conditions for participation in the Kansas 12 medical residency bridging program as are practicable and appropriate to 13 accomplish the purposes of the program or as may be required for the 14 implementation or administration of the program and, in any case, as are 15 not inconsistent with the provisions of this section or the provisions of 16 appropriation acts.

(h) As used in this section, "practice commitment agreement" means
an agreement to commence the full-time practice of medicine and surgery
in a city located in any county in Kansas other than Douglas, Johnson,
Sedgwick, Shawnee or Wyandotte county, which that:

21 (1) Was entered into: (A) By a person in a primary care or mental 22 health care residency training program in general pediatrics, general 23 internal medicine, family medicine-or, family practice, general psychiatry 24 or child psychiatry, that is operated by or affiliated with the university of 25 Kansas school of medicine or other such primary care or mental health care residency training program-which that is operated in Kansas and 26 27 approved by the state board of healing arts; or (B) by a person under 28 subsection (i) with the city where such practice is to commence or another 29 contracting entity other than the university of Kansas school of medicine 30 that is representative of the interests of such city; and

(2) provides benefits to such person that have an aggregate monetary
value equal to or greater than the aggregate amount of payments to such
person from the university of Kansas school of medicine under a residency
bridging loan agreement under this section.

(i) A person who graduated from the university of Kansas school of
medicine prior to July 1, 1992, who has completed the first year of a
primary care residency training program in family practice which is
operated outside the state of Kansas and who has entered into a practice
commitment agreement with the north central Kansas health care
foundation is eligible to enter into a residency bridging loan agreement
under this section.

42 (j) Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, no 43 moneys appropriated for the Kansas medical residency bridging program at the university of Kansas school of medicine, except moneys
 appropriated to the rural health bridging psychiatry fund, shall be
 expended for residency bridging loan agreements for medical residents
 training in general psychiatry or child psychiatry.

5 (k) Subject to appropriations, the university of Kansas school of 6 medicine shall enter into residency bridging loan agreements with three 7 medical residents training in general psychiatry or child psychiatry.

8 There is hereby established in the state treasury the rural health *(*1) 9 bridging psychiatry fund. All moneys credited to the rural health bridging psychiatry fund shall be used only for purposes related to 10 residency bridging loan agreements for medical residents training in 11 general psychiatry or child psychiatry pursuant to K.S.A. 76-387, and 12 amendments thereto. All expenditures from the rural health bridging 13 psychiatry fund shall be made in accordance with appropriation acts 14 upon warrants of the director of accounts and reports issued pursuant to 15 16 vouchers approved by the chancellor of the university of Kansas or the 17 chancellor's designee.

18 {(m) Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, no 19 moneys shall be transferred from the comprehensive grant program 20 account of the state board of regents to the rural health bridging 21 psychiatry fund or expended for any purposes related to the Kansas 22 medical residency bridging program.

Sec. 7. K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 75-3373 is hereby amended to read as 23 follows: 75-3373. (a) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the 24 Kansas department for aging and disability services, solely or in-25 consultation or cooperation with any other state agency, no state agency 26 shall-not enter into any agreement or take any action to outsource or 27 privatize any operations or facilities of the Larned state hospital-or, the 28 Osawatomie state hospital or any facility that provides mental health 29 services and that is operated by a state agency without prior specific 30 authorization by an act of the legislature or an appropriation act of the 31 legislature. The restriction imposed by this subsection applies to any 32 action to outsource or privatize all or any part of any operation or facility 33 of the Larned state hospital, the Osawatomie state hospital or any facility 34 that provides mental health services and that is operated by a state 35 agency, including, but not limited to, any action to transfer all or any part 36 37 of the rated bed capacity at the Larned state hospital or the Osawatomie 38 state hospital, in effect on the effective date of this act, to another facility.

39 (b) Nothing in this section shall prevent the Kansas department for 40 aging and disability services from renewing, in substantially the same 41 form as an existing agreement, any agreement in existence prior to 42 March 4, 2016, for services at the Larned state hospital or the 43 Osawatomie state hospital. 1 (c) Nothing in this section shall prevent the Kansas department for 2 aging and disability services from entering into an agreement for 3 services at the Larned state hospital or the Osawatomie state hospital 4 with a different provider if such agreement is substantially similar to an 5 agreement for services in existence prior to March 4, 2016.
