1 AN ACT concerning agriculture; relating to the Kansas pet animal act;
2 amending K.S.A. 47-1702, 47-1703, 47-1704, 47-1712, 47-1720, 47-
3 1733 and 47-1734 and K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 47-1701, 47-1706, 47-1709,
4 47-1710, 47-1711, 47-1721, 47-1723, 47-1725, 47-1726 and 47-1731
5 and repealing the existing sections; also repealing K.S.A. 47-1717, 47-
6 1719, 47-1732 and 47-1736.

7
8 *Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:*

9 New Section 1. (a) It shall be unlawful for any person to operate a
10 rescue network unless a rescue network manager license has been obtained
11 from the commissioner. Applications for each such license shall be made
12 in writing on a form provided by the commissioner. The license period
13 shall be for the license year ending September 30 following the issuance
14 date.

15 (b) Rescue networks may utilize pet animal foster homes. Each
16 rescue network shall be responsible for ensuring pet animal foster homes
17 subordinate to such rescue network comply with the Kansas pet animal act
18 and all relevant rules and regulations. Rescue networks shall keep records
19 of all pet animal foster homes housing animals ~~and shall pay annually a fee~~
20 ~~of \$30 to the department of agriculture for each subordinate pet animal~~
21 ~~foster home.~~

22 (c) Each rescue network shall designate a manager who shall carry
23 out the following duties:

24 (1) Approve the membership of each pet animal foster home in the
25 rescue network;

26 (2) supervise intake of dogs and cats into the rescue network;

27 (3) monitor and ensure compliance of each subordinate pet animal
28 foster home with all relevant laws and rules and regulations;

29 (4) maintain on such rescue network manager's premises records
30 pertaining to the adoption, placement or other disposition of each dog and
31 cat receiving temporary care from the rescue network, membership of the
32 rescue network, and any other records required by law or rules and
33 regulations; and

34 (5) such other administrative duties as the commissioner may adopt
35 by rules and regulations.

36 (d) The commissioner shall adopt rules and regulations to implement

1 this section.

2 (e) This section shall be part of and supplemental to the Kansas pet
3 animal act.

4 New Sec. 2. (a) Once an animal shelter or rescue network manager
5 license has been obtained, the animal shelter or the rescue network
6 manager may host adoption events at a location other than the licensed
7 premises so long as all applicable rules and regulations are followed at
8 such other locations. ***The animal shelter or rescue network shall provide
9 notice of off-site adoption events that will occur on a regularly
10 scheduled basis throughout the calendar year to the commissioner
11 before January 1 of each such year.*** Once the date and location of ~~an~~
12 ~~adoption event~~ ***any additional adoption events*** has been determined, the
13 animal shelter or rescue network shall provide advance notice to the
14 animal health commissioner or the commissioner's authorized
15 representative.

16 (b) This section shall be part of and supplemental to the Kansas pet
17 animal act.

18 Sec. 3. K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 47-1701 is hereby amended to read as
19 follows: 47-1701. As used in the Kansas pet animal act, unless the context
20 otherwise requires:

21 (a) "Adequate feeding" means supplying at suitable intervals, not to
22 exceed 24 hours, a quantity of wholesome foodstuff suitable for the animal
23 species and age, and sufficient to maintain a reasonable level of nutrition
24 in each animal.

25 (b) "Adequate watering" means a supply of clean, fresh, potable
26 water, supplied in a sanitary manner and either *in adequate amounts at
27 intervals suitable for each animal species or* continuously accessible to
28 each animal ~~or supplied at intervals suitable for the animal species, not to
29 exceed intervals of 12 hours~~ *to maintain the health and well-being of such
30 animals.*

31 (c) "Ambient temperature" means the temperature surrounding the
32 animal.

33 (d) (1) "Animal" means any live dog, cat, rabbit, rodent, nonhuman
34 primate, bird or other warm-blooded vertebrate or any fish, snake or other
35 cold-blooded vertebrate.

36 (2) Animal does not include horses, cattle, sheep, goats, swine,
37 ratites, domesticated deer or domestic fowl.

38 (e) "Animal breeder" means any person who operates an animal
39 breeder premises.

40 (f) "Animal breeder premises" means any premises, *whether licensed
41 or not licensed by the United States department of agriculture*, where all or
42 part of ~~six~~ *three* or more litters of dogs or cats, or both, or 30 or more dogs
43 or cats, or both, are sold, or offered or maintained for sale, ~~primarily at~~

1 ~~wholesale for resale to another.~~

2 (g) "Animal shelter" ~~or "pound"~~ means a ~~facility~~ *premises* which is
3 used or designed for use to house, contain, impound or harbor any seized
4 stray, homeless, relinquished or abandoned animal or a person who acts as
5 an animal rescuer, or who collects and cares for unwanted animals or
6 offers them for adoption. "Animal shelter" ~~or pound~~ also includes a ~~facility~~
7 *premises* of an individual or organization, profit or nonprofit, maintaining
8 20 or more dogs or cats, or both, for the purpose of collecting,
9 accumulating, amassing or maintaining the animals or offering the animals
10 for adoption.

11 (h) "Cat" means an animal which is wholly or in part of the species
12 *Felis domesticus*.

13 (i) "Commissioner" means the animal health commissioner of the
14 Kansas department of agriculture.

15 (j) "Dog" means any animal which is wholly or in part of the species
16 *Canis familiaris*.

17 (k) "Animal control officer" means any person employed by,
18 contracted with or appointed by the state, or any political subdivision
19 thereof, for the *primary* purpose of aiding in the enforcement of ~~this law~~
20 *the Kansas pet animal act*, or any other law or ordinance relating to the
21 licensing or permitting of animals, control of animals or seizure and
22 impoundment of animals, and includes any state, county or municipal law
23 enforcement officer, dog warden, constable or other employee, whose
24 duties in whole or in part include assignments which involve the seizure or
25 taking into custody of any animal.

26 (l) "Euthanasia" means the humane destruction of an animal, which
27 may be accomplished by any of those methods provided for in K.S.A. 47-
28 1718, and amendments thereto.

29 ~~(m) "Hobby breeder premises" means any premises where all or part~~
30 ~~of three, four or five litters of dogs or cats, or both, are produced for sale~~
31 ~~or sold, offered or maintained for sale per license year. This provision~~
32 ~~applies only if the total number of dogs or cats, or both, sold, offered or~~
33 ~~maintained for sale is less than 30 individual animals.~~

34 ~~(n) "Hobby breeder" means any person who operates a hobby breeder~~
35 ~~premises.~~

36 ~~(o)~~ (m) "Housing facility" means any room, building or area used to
37 contain a primary enclosure or enclosures.

38 ~~(p)~~ (n) "Boarding or training ~~kennel~~ *premises* operator" means any
39 person who operates an establishment where four or more dogs or cats, or
40 both, are maintained in any one week during the license year for boarding,
41 training or similar purposes for a fee or compensation.

42 ~~(q)~~ (o) "Boarding or training ~~kennel~~ *operator* premises" means the
43 facility of a boarding or training ~~kennel~~ operator.

1 ~~(†)~~(p) "License year" or "permit year" means the 12-month period
2 ending on ~~June~~ *September 30*.

3 ~~(s)~~(q) "Person" means any individual, association, partnership,
4 corporation or other entity.

5 ~~(†)~~(r) (1) "Pet shop" means any premises where there are sold, or
6 offered or maintained for sale, at retail and not for resale to another:

7 (A) Any dogs or cats, or both; or (B) any other animals except those
8 which are produced and raised on such premises and are sold, or offered or
9 maintained for sale, by a person who resides on such premises.

10 (2) Pet shop does not include: (A) Any ~~pound~~ or animal shelter; (B)
11 any premises where only fish are sold, or offered or maintained for sale; or
12 (C) any animal distributor premises, ~~hobby breeder premises, retail breeder~~
13 ~~premises~~ *rescue network, pet animal foster home premises* or animal
14 breeder premises.

15 (3) Nothing in this section prohibits inspection of those premises
16 which sell only fish to verify that only fish are being sold.

17 ~~(†)~~(s) "Pet shop operator" means any person who operates a pet
18 shop.

19 ~~(v)~~(t) "Primary enclosure" means any structure used or designed for
20 use to restrict any animal to a limited amount of space, such as a room,
21 pen, ~~or cage, compartment or hutch~~.

22 ~~(w)~~(u) "Research facility" means any place, laboratory or institution,
23 except an elementary school, secondary school, college or university, at
24 which any scientific test, experiment or investigation involving the use of
25 any living animal is carried out, conducted or attempted.

26 ~~(x)~~(v) "Sale," "sell" and "sold" include transfers by sale or exchange.
27 Maintaining animals for sale is presumed whenever 20 or more dogs or
28 cats, or both, are maintained by any person *or on one premises*.

29 ~~(y)~~(w) "Sanitize" means to make physically clean and to remove and
30 destroy, to a practical minimum, agents injurious to health, at such
31 intervals as necessary.

32 ~~(z)~~(x) "Animal distributor" means any person who operates an
33 animal distributor premises.

34 ~~(aa)~~(y) "Animal distributor premises" means the premises of any
35 person engaged in the business of buying for resale dogs or cats, or both,
36 as a principal or agent, or who holds such distributor's self out to be so
37 engaged.

38 ~~(bb)~~(z) "Out-of-state distributor" means any person residing in a state
39 other than Kansas, who is engaged in the business of buying for resale
40 dogs or cats, or both, within the state of Kansas, as a principal or agent, *or*
41 *who holds such person's self out to be so engaged*.

42 ~~(ee)~~(aa) "Food animals" means rodents, rabbits, reptiles, fish or
43 amphibians that are sold or offered or maintained for sale for the sole

1 purpose of being consumed as food by other animals.

2 ~~(dd)(bb)~~ "Adequate veterinary medical care" means:

3 (1) A documented program of disease control and prevention,
4 euthanasia and routine veterinary care shall be established and maintained
5 under the supervision of a licensed veterinarian, on a form provided by the
6 commissioner, and shall include a documented on-site visit to the premises
7 by the veterinarian at least once a year; **and**

8 (2) that diseased, ill, injured, lame or blind animals shall be provided
9 with veterinary care as is needed for the health and well-being of the
10 animal, and such veterinary care shall be documented and maintained on
11 the premises; **and**

12 ~~(3) all documentation required by subsections (dd) (bb)(1) and (dd)~~
13 ~~(bb)(2) shall be made available to the commissioner or the commissioner's~~
14 ~~authorized representative for inspection or copying upon request and shall~~
15 ~~be maintained for three years after the effective date of the program or the~~
16 ~~administration of such veterinary care.~~

17 ~~(4) As used in the Kansas pet animal act, "adequate veterinary~~
18 ~~medical care" shall not apply to United States department of agriculture~~
19 ~~licensed animal breeders or animal distributors. *United States department*~~
20 ~~*of agriculture licensed animal breeders and animal distributors may use*~~
21 ~~*their United States department of agriculture veterinary care forms to*~~
22 ~~*meet the requirements of this subsection. Such records shall be made*~~
23 ~~*available to Kansas department of agriculture inspectors for inspection or*~~
24 ~~*copying upon request and shall be maintained for three years after the*~~
25 ~~*effective date of the program or the administration of such veterinary care.*~~

26 ~~(ee)(cc)~~ "Ratites" means all creatures of the ratite family that are not
27 indigenous to this state, including, but not limited to, ostriches, emus and
28 rheas.

29 ~~(ff)~~ "Retail breeder" means any person who operates a retail breeder
30 premises:

31 ~~(gg)~~ "Retail breeder premises" means any premises where all or part
32 of six or more litters or 30 or more dogs or cats, or both, are sold, or
33 offered or maintained for sale, primarily at retail and not for resale to
34 another.

35 ~~(hh)~~ "Retail" means any transaction where the animal is sold to the
36 final consumer.

37 ~~(ii)~~ "Wholesale" means any transaction where the animal is sold for
38 the purpose of resale to another.

39 ~~(dd)~~ "Rescue network" means the premises of a rescue network
40 manager and all pet animal foster homes organized under such rescue
41 network manager that provide temporary care for one or more dogs or
42 cats not owned by an animal shelter that maintains a central facility for
43 keeping animals.

1 (ee) "Rescue network manager" means the individual designated by a
2 rescue network to carry out the responsibilities prescribed in section 1,
3 and amendments thereto.

4 (ff) "Pet animal foster home" means the registered premises of an
5 individual who has written and signed an agreement to provide temporary
6 care for one or more dogs or cats owned by an animal shelter or a rescue
7 network that is licensed by the state.

8 Sec. 4. K.S.A. 47-1702 is hereby amended to read as follows: 47-
9 1702. It shall be unlawful for any person to act as or be an animal
10 distributor unless such person has obtained from the commissioner an
11 animal distributor license for each animal distributor premises operated by
12 such person. Application for such license shall be made in writing on a
13 form provided by the commissioner. The license period shall be for the
14 license year ending on ~~June~~ September 30 following the issuance date.

15 Sec. 5. K.S.A. 47-1703 is hereby amended to read as follows: 47-
16 1703. It shall be unlawful for any person to act as or be a pet shop operator
17 unless such person has obtained from the commissioner a pet shop
18 operator license for each pet shop operated by such person. Application for
19 each such license shall be made in writing on a form provided by the
20 commissioner. The license period shall be for the license year ending on
21 ~~June~~ September 30 following the issuance date.

22 Sec. 6. K.S.A. 47-1704 is hereby amended to read as follows: 47-
23 1704. (a) It shall be unlawful for any person to operate ~~a pound or an~~
24 animal shelter, except a licensed veterinarian who operates such ~~pound or~~
25 animal shelter from such licensed veterinarian's clinic, unless a license for
26 such ~~pound or animal~~ shelter has been obtained from the commissioner.
27 Application for such license shall be made on a form provided by the
28 commissioner. The license period shall be for the license year ending on
29 ~~June~~ September 30 following the issuance date.

30 (b) *Animal shelters may utilize pet animal foster homes. Each animal*
31 *shelter shall be responsible for ensuring pet animal foster homes*
32 *subordinate to such animal shelter comply with the Kansas pet animal act*
33 *and all relevant rules and regulations. Animal shelters shall keep records*
34 *of all pet animal foster homes housing animals ~~and shall pay annually a~~*
35 *fee of \$30 to the department of agriculture for each subordinate pet*
36 *animal foster home.*

37 Sec. 7. K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 47-1706 is hereby amended to read as
38 follows: 47-1706. (a) The commissioner may refuse to issue or renew or
39 may suspend or revoke any license or permit required under K.S.A. 47-
40 1701 et seq., and amendments thereto, for any one or more of the
41 following reasons:

42 (1) Material misstatement in the application for the original license or
43 permit, or in the application for any renewal of a license or permit;

1 (2) willful disregard of any provision of the Kansas pet animal act or
2 any rule and regulation adopted hereunder, or any willful aiding or
3 abetting of another in the violation of any provision of the Kansas pet
4 animal act or any rule and regulation adopted hereunder;

5 (3) permitting any license or permit issued hereunder to be used by an
6 unlicensed or unpermitted person or transferred to unlicensed or
7 unpermitted premises;

8 (4) the conviction of any crime relating to the theft of animals;

9 (5) substantial misrepresentation;

10 (6) misrepresentation or false promise, made through advertising,
11 salespersons, agents or otherwise, in connection with the operation of
12 business of the licensee or permittee;

13 (7) fraudulent bill of sale;

14 (8) the housing facility or the primary enclosure is inadequate;

15 (9) the feeding, watering, sanitizing and housing practices at the
16 licensee's or permittee's premises are not consistent with the Kansas pet
17 animal act or the rules and regulations adopted hereunder;

18 (10) failure to provide adequate veterinary medical care to the
19 animals in such licensee or permittee's custody or care; ~~or~~

20 (11) failure to maintain or provide documentation of the provision of
21 adequate veterinary medical care, as required in K.S.A. 47-1701~~(dd)~~(bb),
22 and amendments thereto, to animals in such licensee or permittee's custody
23 or care when access to such is requested by the commissioner or the
24 commissioner's authorized representatives;

25 **(12) three failed inspections within 24 months; or**

26 **(13) refusal to allow the commissioner or the commissioner's**
27 **authorized, trained representative entry onto the premises for inspection.**

28 (b) The commissioner shall refuse to issue or renew and shall suspend
29 or revoke any license or permit required under K.S.A. 47-1701 et seq., and
30 amendments thereto, for a conviction of cruelty to animals, K.S.A. 21-
31 4310, prior to its repeal, or ~~subsections (a)(1) through (a)(5) of~~ pursuant to
32 K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 21-6412(a)(1) through (a)(5), and amendments thereto,
33 or any federal law, city ordinance or county resolution that proscribes
34 cruelty to animals.

35 (c) Any refusal to issue or renew a license or permit, and any
36 suspension or revocation of a license or permit, under this section shall be
37 issued only after notice and opportunity for a hearing are provided in
38 accordance with the provisions of the Kansas administrative procedure act
39 and shall be subject to review in accordance with the Kansas judicial
40 review act.

41 (d) Notwithstanding subsection (c), nothing shall preclude the
42 commissioner from issuing a quarantine order in accordance with K.S.A.
43 77-536, and amendments thereto, on any premises regulated under this act

1 wherein the animals are found to be infected with a contagious or zoonotic
2 disease which may infect animals or humans that may come into contact
3 with or be exposed to such animals.

4 (e) Whenever the commissioner denies, suspends or revokes a license
5 or permit under this section, the commissioner or the commissioner's
6 authorized, trained representatives shall seize and impound any animals in
7 the possession, custody or care of the person whose license or permit is
8 denied, suspended or revoked if there are reasonable grounds to believe
9 that the animals' health, safety or welfare is endangered. Except as
10 provided by K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 21-6412, and amendments thereto, such
11 animals may be returned to the person owning them if there is satisfactory
12 evidence that the animals will receive adequate care by that person or such
13 animals may be sold, placed or euthanized, at the discretion of the
14 commissioner. Costs of care and services for such animals while seized
15 and impounded shall be paid by the person from whom the animals were
16 seized and impounded, if that person's license or permit is denied,
17 suspended or revoked. Such funds shall be paid to the commissioner for
18 reimbursement of care and services provided during seizure and
19 impoundment. If such person's license or permit is not denied, suspended
20 or revoked, the commissioner shall pay the costs of care and services
21 provided during seizure and impoundment.

22 Sec. 8. K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 47-1709 is hereby amended to read as
23 follows: 47-1709. (a) The commissioner or the commissioner's authorized,
24 trained representatives shall make an inspection of the premises for which
25 an application for an original license or permit is made under K.S.A. 47-
26 1701 et seq., and amendments thereto, before issuance of such license or
27 permit. No license or permit shall be issued by the commissioner to an
28 applicant described in this subsection until the premises for which
29 application is made has passed a licensing or permitting inspection. The
30 application for a license shall conclusively be deemed to be the consent of
31 the applicant to the right of entry and inspection of the premises sought to
32 be licensed or permitted by the commissioner or the commissioner's
33 authorized, trained representatives at reasonable times with the owner or
34 owner's representative present. ~~Refusal of such entry and inspection shall~~
35 ~~be grounds for denial of the license or permit.~~ Notice ~~need not~~ *will* be
36 given to any person prior to ~~inspection~~ *an inspection made for an*
37 *application for an original license or permit.*

38 (b) The commissioner or the commissioner's authorized, trained
39 representatives ~~may~~ *shall* inspect each premises for which a license or
40 permit has been issued under K.S.A. 47-1701 et seq., and amendments
41 thereto, *based upon an inspection frequency schedule adopted by rules*
42 *and regulations. Such frequency schedule* ~~may~~ *shall* take into account the
43 *performance history of a premises or the relative risk posed by such*

1 *premises to the health, safety and welfare of the animals.* The acceptance
2 of a license or permit shall conclusively be deemed to be the consent of the
3 licensee or permittee to the right of entry and inspection of the licensed or
4 permitted premises by the commissioner or the commissioner's authorized,
5 trained representatives at reasonable times with the owner or owner's
6 representative present. ~~Refusal of such entry and inspection shall be~~
7 ~~grounds for suspension or revocation of the license or permit.~~ Notice need
8 *will* not be given to any person prior to inspection.

9 (c) (1) *The commissioner or the commissioner's authorized, trained*
10 *representative may review the documentation to ensure adequate*
11 *veterinary medical care has been provided. All documentation provided*
12 *pursuant to this subsection shall be made available to the commissioner*
13 *or the commissioner's authorized, trained representative for inspection*
14 *or copying upon request. Such documentation shall be maintained for*
15 *three years after the effective date of the program or the administration*
16 *of such veterinary medical care.*

17 (2) *United States department of agriculture licensed animal breeders*
18 *and animal distributors may use their United States department of*
19 *agriculture veterinary care forms to meet the requirements of this*
20 *subsection if they make such forms available to the commissioner or the*
21 *commissioner's authorized, trained representative for inspection or*
22 *copying upon request and have maintained such records for three years*
23 *after the effective date of the program or the administration of such*
24 *veterinary medical care.*

25 (d) The commissioner or the commissioner's authorized, trained
26 representatives shall make inspections of the premises of a person required
27 to be licensed or permitted under K.S.A. 47-1701 et seq., and amendments
28 thereto, upon a determination by the commissioner that there are
29 reasonable grounds to believe that the person is violating the provisions of
30 K.S.A 47-1701 et seq., and amendments thereto, or rules and regulations
31 adopted thereunder or that there are grounds for suspension or revocation
32 of such person's license or permit.

33 (d) (e) Any complaint filed with the commissioner shall be
34 confidential and shall not be released to any person other than employees
35 of the commissioner as necessary to carry out the duties of their
36 employment.

37 (e) (f) Any person making inspections under this section shall be
38 trained by the commissioner in reasonable standards of animal care.

39 (f) (g) The commissioner may request a licensed veterinarian to assist
40 in any inspection or investigation made by the commissioner or the
41 commissioner's authorized representative under this section.

42 (g) (h) Any person acting as the commissioner's authorized
43 representative for purposes of making inspections and conducting

1 investigations under this section who knowingly falsifies the results or
2 findings of any inspection or investigation or intentionally fails or refuses
3 to make an inspection or conduct an investigation pursuant to this section
4 shall be guilty of a class A nonperson misdemeanor.

5 ~~(h)~~ **(i)** No person shall act as the commissioner's authorized
6 representative for the purposes of making inspections and conducting
7 investigations under this section if such person has a beneficial interest in
8 a person required to be licensed or permitted pursuant to K.S.A. 47-1701
9 et seq., and amendments thereto.

10 ~~(i)~~ **(j)** Records of inspections pursuant to this section shall be
11 maintained in the office of the Kansas department of agriculture division
12 of animal health. ~~Records of a deficiency or violation shall not be~~
13 ~~maintained for longer than three years after the deficiency or violation is~~
14 ~~remedied and retained pursuant to applicable retention schedules.~~

15 ~~(j)~~ **(k)** The commissioner, in consultation with Kansas state university
16 college of veterinary medicine, shall: (1) Continue procedures to provide
17 for pet animal training or updated training for authorized trained
18 representatives who inspect premises under the pet animal act and to allow
19 the owners of such facilities licensed or permitted under the pet animal act
20 to attend and participate at the training workshops for the authorized
21 trained representatives; and (2) make available to such owners and other
22 interested persons an inspection handbook describing the duties and
23 responsibilities of such authorized trained representatives.

24 ~~(k)~~ **(l)** If the commissioner or the commissioner's authorized
25 representative is denied access to any location where such access is sought
26 for the purposes authorized under the Kansas pet animal act, the
27 commissioner may apply to any court of competent jurisdiction for an
28 administrative search warrant authorizing access to such location for such
29 purposes. Upon such application and a showing of cause therefore, the
30 court shall issue the search warrant for the purposes requested.

31 Sec. 9. K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 47-1710 is hereby amended to read as
32 follows: 47-1710. (a) An animal shall not be disposed of by an owner or
33 operator of ~~a pound or of an animal shelter as a pound~~ until after
34 expiration of a minimum of three full business days of custody, *not*
35 *including the day the animal arrives*, during which the public has clear
36 *physical* access to inspect and recover the animal through time periods
37 ordinarily accepted as usual business hours. During such time of custody,
38 any owner or operator of such ~~facility premises~~ shall attempt to notify the
39 owner or custodian of any animal maintained or impounded by such
40 ~~facility premises~~ if such owner or custodian is known or reasonably
41 ascertainable. Such an animal may at any time be released to the legal
42 owner, moved to a veterinary hospital for treatment or observation,
