SUPPLEMENTAL NOTE ON SENATE BILL NO. 288

As Recommended by Senate Committee on Judiciary

Brief*

SB 288 would repeal a statute making it a misdemeanor, subject to a fine of \$100, imprisonment in the county jail up to 30 days, or both, if a person knowingly causes or procures any process issued from a justice's court in a civil suit to be served on Saturday upon a person whose religious faith recognizes Saturdays as the Sabbath or who shall serve any such process made returnable on that day.

Background

The bill was introduced by the Senate Committee on Judiciary at the request of the Johnson County Sheriff's Office. In the Senate Committee on Judiciary hearing, a representative of that office appeared in support of the bill noting the law has limited the ability of law enforcement to serve civil process on Saturdays. No other testimony was provided.

According to the fiscal note prepared by the Division of the Budget, enactment of the bill would have no fiscal effect upon the Judicial Branch.
