Chairman Proehl and members of the House Transportation Committee,

On behalf of the Emergency Nurses Association (ENA), I am pleased to provide testimony in support of HB 2088, creating the negligent driving violation.

The ENA comprises more than 43,000 members worldwide, including nearly 350 members in Kansas. On a daily basis, emergency nurses see the devastating effects of motor vehicle crashes as we care for injured patients. These injuries are preventable and we support measures like HB 2088 to enhance the safety of Kansans.

In their 2015 report, National Highway Traffic Safety Administration attributes 94 percent of serious crashes to driver factors, rather than environment or vehicle factors. In crashes in which the driver's errors were the cause, almost half are due to recognition error, including driver inattention, distractions and inadequate surveillance. In order to save the lives and decrease serious injuries of Kansans on our roadways, our drivers must remain attentive to the task of driving. The Emergency Nurses Association supports reasonable penalties when they fail to do so.

We respectfully request that committee members support HB 2088.

## Written testimony presented to the House Transportation Committee House Bill 2088

Chairman Proehl and members of the House Transportation Committee,

Safe Kids Kansas is pleased to provide testimony in support of HB 2088. Safe Kids Kansas is a nonprofit coalition of over 70 statewide organizations and businesses dedicated to preventing unintentional injuries and injury-related death to Kansas children ages 0-19.

As injury prevention specialists and safety advocates, we know that driving a vehicle weighing two or more tons on our roadways is a serious responsibility. The driver must not only process hundreds of tiny decisions each mile driven for their own safety, but also for the safety of others using or crossing these shared roads. In addition, there are distractions in excess, from alerts on the dashboard, music on the radio, conversations that may be taking place with passengers, and more. In the matter of just a moment, the driver's attention may be pulled away from other things, such as a bicyclist in the lane ahead, or a pedestrian walking on a stretch of road without sidewalks. As drivers, it is our responsibility to take caution and be aware of our surroundings. When a person is negligent in their driving responsibilities, it can result in serious or fatal consequences.

We support HB 2088 and reasonable penalties for negligent driving behaviors.
