Subject: Senate Bill No. 264

Summary

Senate Bill No. 264 relates to county appraisers and amends K.S.A. 2019 Supp. 19-432 to add to the acts or omissions for which the director of property valuation may remove a person from the list of persons eligible to be appointed county appraiser and to add a notice requirement when a person no longer holds the office of county appraiser.

The bill amends K.S.A. 2019 Supp. 19-432(c) to provide that the director may remove a person from the eligibility list due to termination of the person from the office of county or district appraiser in one or more counties.

A new subsection (d) provides that the board of county commissioners or governing body of any unified government shall notify the director of property valuation when a person no longer holds the office of county appraiser for such county. The notice shall be made on a form provided by the director. If the person does not complete the four-year term, then the notice shall include the reason therefor, unless otherwise precluded by law. The director shall also make a notation on the eligibility list.

The bill would take effect from and after its publication in the statute book.
