Newspapers have been a standardized source of information for centuries. Everyone is familiar with them.

Citizens know they can find official notices of all kinds in newspapers. I often see people who are not subscribers, purchase newspapers in our office or at a rack because they know a legal publication of interest to them should be in that edition. If you start allowing multiple locations for public notice, you're going to confuse the public.

If your goal is to preserve a very "public" notice, you should endeavor to preserve this effort for transparency by restricting public notice to newspapers only.
