1 AN ACT concerning postsecondary education; relating to scholarship 2 programs; creating the Kansas reinvest in postsecondary education act.

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4 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

5 Section 1. The provisions of sections 1 through 7, and amendments 6 thereto, shall be known and may be cited as the Kansas reinvest in 7 postsecondary education act.

8 Sec. 2. As used in sections 1 through 7, and amendments thereto:

9 (a) "Board" means the state board of regents provided for in the 10 constitution of this state and described in article 32 of chapter 74 of the 11 Kansas Statutes Annotated, and amendments thereto.

(b) "Bridge program" means a baccalaureate degree program
approved by the board for the Kansas RISE scholarship program whereby
a student holding an associate degree may obtain a bachelor's degree from
a four-year eligible postsecondary educational institution within two years
after entering such baccalaureate program.

17 (c) "Continuous enrollment" means a student is enrolled in a 18 minimum of six credit hours in each of the fall and spring semesters of a 19 single academic year until such student has graduated or completed the 20 certificate program. Enrollment during the summer is not required for 21 "continuous enrollment."

(d) "Eligible high school" means any public or private secondaryschool located in Kansas.

(e) "Eligible postsecondary educational institution" means any
 postsecondary educational institution or any private postsecondary
 educational institution that:

(1) Is accredited by and in good standing with the higher learning
 commission of the north central association of colleges and universities;
 and

30 (2) offers an associate degree or an industry-recognized certificate in31 a technical profession.

(f) "Eligible postsecondary education program" means an associate
degree program, a career and technical education program or a bridge
program that is offered by an eligible postsecondary educational institution
whereby a student can obtain a degree or an industry-recognized certificate
in a technical profession.

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(g) "Four-year eligible postsecondary educational institution" means
 an eligible postsecondary educational institution that offers baccalaureate
 degrees in addition to associate degrees or industry-recognized certificates
 in technical professions.

5 (h) "Gift aid" means financial aid received from a federal Pell grant 6 and any other scholarship or financial assistance awards that do not require 7 repayment.

8 (i) "Postsecondary educational institution" means the same as defined 9 in K.S.A. 74-3201b, and amendments thereto.

10 (j) "Private postsecondary educational institution" means an entity 11 that is not a postsecondary educational institution, and that:

12 (1) Is a business enterprise, whether operated on a for-profit or not-13 for-profit basis;

(2) has a physical presence within the state of Kansas; and

(3) offers a course or courses of instruction or study through
classroom contact or by distance education, or both, for the purpose of
training or preparing persons for a field of endeavor in a business, trade,
technical or industrial occupation, or that offers a course or courses leading
to an academic degree.

(k) "Semester" means one of two principal terms, when there are only
two principal terms in the academic year, whether or not there are other
shorter terms during the same academic year.

23 Sec. 3. (a) There is hereby established the Kansas RISE scholarship 24 program. The state board of regents shall administer such program, and 25 shall:

(1) Publicize Kansas RISE scholarships, including the list of eligible
 postsecondary education programs and information regarding application
 procedures and deadlines;

29 (2) review and approve or deny applications for a Kansas RISE30 scholarship;

(3) request any information from an eligible postsecondary
 educational institution the board deems necessary for the administration of
 this act;

34 (4) establish requirements for mentoring and guidance sessions for35 students participating in the program; and

(5) annually evaluate the Kansas RISE scholarship program and
 prepare and submit reports in accordance with section 7, and amendments
 thereto.

(b) On or before January 1, 2021, the board shall adopt rules and
regulations for the implementation and administration of this act,
including, but not limited to:

- 42 (1) Deadlines for applications to be submitted;

To be eligible for a Kansas RISE scholarship, a student shall: (a) Be a Kansas resident; (b) (1) be enrolled in grade 12 in an eligible high school; (2) have graduated from an eligible high school not less than five years prior to applying for a Kansas RISE scholarship; (3) have been in the custody of the secretary for children and families as a minor pursuant to the revised Kansas code for care of children at any time while enrolled in any of the grades six through 12; or (4) have obtained a general educational development (GED) 	or high school equ

	23	Sec. 5. (a) Subject to the limitation provided in subsection (b), the	
	24	amount of a Kansas RISE scholarship for a student for each semester shall	
	25	be: (1) The aggregate amount of tuition and mandatory fees for the eligible	
	26	postsecondary education program for the semester in which the student is	
	27 28	enrolled less the aggregate amount of all other gift aid awarded to such student for such semester; plus (2) an amount equal to \$250 to pay for all,	
	28 29	or a portion of, the cost of books and materials for such semester.	
	30	(b) If a student is enrolled in an eligible postsecondary education	
	31	program offered by a four-year eligible postsecondary educational	
í	32	institution, the aggregate amount of tuition, mandatory fees and the cost of	
	33	books and materials for such eligible postsecondary education program	
	34	shall be the average cost of tuition, mandatory fees and the cost of books	
	35	and materials for such eligible postsecondary education program when	
	36 37	offered by an eligible public postsecondary educational institution that is not a four-year institution.	
	38	(c) The amount of a Kansas RISE scholarship for a student enrolled	
	39	in an eligible postsecondary education program offered by a four-year

4	41	from such four-year eligible postsecondary educational institution's	
	42	endowment or other scholarship granting fund for every \$1 paid by the

1 Sec. 6. (a) A student who has been approved for a Kansas RISE 2 scholarship shall continue to receive a Kansas RISE scholarship for up to 3 two years from the date such student enrolls in an eligible postsecondary 4 education program pursuant to section 4(f), and amendments thereto, 5 provided, such student:

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6 (1) Is continuously enrolled in such eligible postsecondary education 7 program;

8 (2) maintains a cumulative grade point average that is not less than-9 2.0, and

10 (3) continues to participate in mentoring and guidance sessions as 11 required by the board.

(b) A student who has an approved medical or personal leave of 12 absence from an eligible postsecondary educational institution may 13 continue to receive such student's Kansas RISE scholarship upon resuming 14 such student's education at an eligible postsecondary educational 15 institution, provided, such student continues to satisfy all applicable 16 eligibility requirements. The aggregate amount of approved leave for a 17 student shall not exceed six months, except as provided in rules and 18 regulations adopted by the board. 19

Sec. 7. (a) On or before January 15, 2022, and each January 15 thereafter, the board shall prepare and submit a report to the legislature and the governor on the Kansas RISE scholarship program. The report shall provide the following information for the immediately preceding academic year:

(1) The number of students who applied for a Kansas RISE
scholarship, the total number of students receiving a scholarship and the
number of students receiving a scholarship disaggregated by those students
who are eligible pursuant to section 4(b)(1), (2), (3) and (4), and
amendments thereto;

30 (2) the total amount of scholarship moneys awarded and the amount 31 of scholarship moneys awarded disaggregated by those students who are 32 eligible pursuant to section 4(b)(1), (2), (3) and (4), and amendments 33 thereto;

34 (3) the number of students who completed an eligible postsecondary35 education program; and

36 (4) the number of students who became employed within six months37 after completion of an eligible postsecondary education program.

(b) On or before January 15, 2022, the board shall prepare and submit
a report to the legislature and the governor that evaluates and makes
recommendations regarding funding for Kansas RISE scholarships under
the provisions of section 5(c), and amendments thereto.

42 Sec. 8. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its 43 publication in the statute book. satisfactory academic progress

Sec. 7. (a) As a condition of receiving a Kansas RISE scholarship, the student shall agree to commence work for three consecutive years in the state of Kansas within six months of completion of an associate degree program, career and technical education program or bridge program.

(b) The student shall maintain records and make reports to the board on such forms and in such manner as required by the board to document the satisfaction of the work requirement pursuant to subsection (a).

(c) (1) If any student who receives a Kansas RISE scholarship fails to satisfy the requirements of subsections (a) and (b), such student shall pay an amount equal to the total amount of scholarship money received by such student that is financed by the state of Kansas plus accrued interest at a rate equivalent to the interest rate applicable to loans made under the federal PLUS program at the time such person first entered into an agreement. Installment payments of such amounts may be made in accordance with rules and regulations of the board. Such installment payments shall begin six months after the date such student fails to satisfy the requirements of subsection (a) or (b), as determined by the board. All moneys received pursuant to this subsection shall be remitted to the state treasurer in accordance with the provisions of K.S.A. 75-4215, and amendments thereto. Upon receipt of each such remittance, the state treasurer shall deposit the entire amount in the state treasury to the credit of the state general fund.

(2) The board is authorized to turn any repayment account arising under this act to a designated loan servicer or collection agency, the state not being involved other than to receive payments from the loan servicer or collection agency at the interest rate prescribed under this subsection.

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
