The Kansas Department of Labor estimates the bill would reduce revenue to the Unemployment Insurance Trust Fund by \$66.0 million in FY 2021. The Department notes that the Unemployment Insurance Trust Fund is currently solvent, but the rapidly changing economic conditions resulting from the COVID-19 crisis make it difficult to estimate the long-term fiscal effect from SB 501. Any fiscal effect associated with SB 501 is not reflected in *The FY 2021 Governor's Budget Report*.
