AN ACT concerning agriculture; relating to eggs; repacking requirements 1 2 for retailers; amending K.S.A. 2019 Supp. 2-2510 and repealing the existing section. 3 4 5 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas: 6 Section 1. K.S.A. 2019 Supp. 2-2510 is hereby amended to read as 7 follows: 2-2510. (a) A retailer may repack eggs located in a store as long 8 as the following requirements in subsection (b) or (c) are met:. 9 (b) Repacked eggs may be graded as grade B if: 10 (1) Eggs eligible for repacking include dirty eggs or eggs in 11 containers with broken eggs. Eggs that are determined to pose a health risk 12 shall not be eligible for repacking; 13 (2) the eggs are not subject to a stop sale order issued by the 14 secretary; (3) eggs cannot be repacked more than once: 15 16 (4) repacked eggs must meet grade B requirements and shall not be graded higher than grade B, except as provided in subsection (b) (c); 17 18 (5) all containers shall have the necessary following labeling 19 requirements printed on the outside of the carton which shall include: 20 (A) Grade and size: 21 (B) a statement saying that the eggs have been repacked by the 22 retailer where the eggs are located; 23 (C) name and address of the retailer that repacked the eggs; 24 (D) a statement containing the phrase, "Keep refrigerated at or below 25 45° Fahrenheit"; 26 (E) the expiration date-which shall be *that is* the earliest expiration 27 date of the repacked eggs; and 28 (F) an inspection fee stamp on the carton indicating that the 29 inspection fee has been paid, unless-repackaged repacked as described in 30 subsection (b) (c) in a carton that has already been assessed the inspection 31 fee: 32 (6) records must be kept and available for inspection on all eggs 33 repacked by the retailer; and 34 (7)eggs remain subject to inspection and the requirements of this act. (b) Repackaged(c) Repacked eggs may be graded higher than grade 35 36 B if:

(1) Undamaged eggs from damaged containers are placed only into 1 containers with the same distributor and packer information, including the 2 name, address, United States department of agriculture plant number, and 3 4 packaging code;

5 (2) no container with repackaged repacked eggs-are is labeled with a 6 declaration of enhanced quality or with any claim that did not appear on 7 the original container;

8 (3) all eggs with undamaged shells are handled and repackaged 9 repacked employing good manufacturing practices under refrigerated conditions in accordance with United States food and drug administration 10 regulations: 11

12 (4) all damaged containers and packaging material identified with the United States department of agriculture grade shield are destroyed; and 13

14 (5) all segregated inedible eggs are properly destroyed to prevent 15 human consumption. 16

Retailers may lose the privilege to repack eggs if: (e)(d)

17 (1) The retailer is found postdating repacked eggs;

(2) the eggs do not meet grade B or higher standards: and 18

(3) the retailer has violated any other provision of this act. 19

20 (d)(e) The provisions of this section shall be a part of and 21 supplemental to the Kansas egg law.

22 Sec. 2. K.S.A. 2019 Supp. 2-2510 is hereby repealed.
