## **HOUSE BILL No. 2623**

AN ACT concerning energy; relating to electric generation; solar power; state biological survey; establishing requirements for pollinator-friendly solar sites; amending K.S.A. 74-6607 and repealing the existing section.

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Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

New Section 1. (a) In consultation with other state and nongovernmental entities with pollinator expertise, the state biological survey shall publish a pollinator-friendly solar site scorecard. The scorecard shall be posted on the biological survey's website on or before January 1, 2021.

- (b) An owner of a solar site may claim that such site is pollinator-friendly or provides benefits to pollinators if:
- (1) Such site and the site's vegetation management plan adheres to the state biological survey's scorecard criteria; and
- (2) the owner implements solar site management practices upon such site.
- (c) An owner of a solar site that claims that such site is pollinator-friendly or provides benefits to pollinators shall make the solar site's completed scorecard and vegetation management plan available to the public and submit a copy to the state biological survey for publishing pursuant to K.S.A. 74-6607, and amendments thereto, and any nonprofit solar industry trade associations of this state.
- (d) The provisions of this section shall be known and may be cited as the Kansas solar pollinator habitat act.
  - (e) As used in this act:
- (1) "Native perennial vegetation" means perennial Kansas wildflowers, shrubs, grasses or other plants that serve as beneficial habitat, forage or migratory way stations for pollinators;
- (2) "pollinators" means bees, birds, butterflies and other insects or wildlife that pollinate flowering plants, including wild and managed insects;
  - (3) "solar site" means a ground-mounted solar system for generating electricity that is at least one acre in size;
  - (4) "solar site management practice" means the implementation of any practice or method on or around a solar site that provides native

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perennial vegetation and foraging habitat around such site that is beneficial to pollinators and reduces stormwater runoff or erosion; and

- (5) "vegetation management plan" means a written document that includes short- and long-term solar site management practices that will provide and maintain native perennial vegetation.
- Sec. 2. K.S.A. 74-6607 is hereby amended to read as follows: 74-6607. The state biological survey is hereby authorized and empowered to:
- (a) Adopt rules and regulations in accordance with the provisions of K.S.A. 77-415 et seq. *and amendements thereto*, for:
- (1) -The selection, acquisition, management, protection and use of natural and scientific areas and preserves; for
- (2) -the registration of natural and scientific areas and preserves; for and
- (3) -the dedication of natural and scientific areas and preserves within the state system;
- (b) develop a natural and scientific areas preservation policy for the state;
- (c) develop a comprehensive long-range plan for the preservation, control and management of the natural and scientific areas of the state;
- (d) seek and approve the dedication of natural and scientific areas to be included in the state system;
- (e) maintain a registry of natural and scientific areas, an inventory of natural ecosystems; an inventory of habitats of rare and endangered species of plants and animals; significant geological and archeological sites; and other natural and scientific areas and preserves;
- (f) publish a pollinator-friendly solar site scorecard and maintain a registry of such completed scorecards and corresponding vegetation management plans pursuant to section 1, amendments and thereto;
- (g) conduct research, investigations, and interpretive programs and publish and disseminate information and recommendations pertaining to natural and scientific preserves and other natural and scientific areas;
- (g)(h) employ or contract for consultants-and fix their compensations, who shall be in the unclassified service under the Kansas civil service act and fix their compensations;
- $\frac{h}{h}(i)$  submit to the governor and the legislature annually its recommendations for new or amendatory legislation and funding for the preservation of the state's natural and scientific areas; and submit to the secretary of state in even numbered years a report of its activities for inclusion in the biennial report in accordance with the provisions of K.S.A. 75-3044 et seq, and amendments thereto.
- Sec. 3. K.S.A. 74-6607 is hereby repealed.
- Sec. 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the statute book.
