AN ACT concerning the university of Kansas school of medicine; relating
 to the medical student loan program; medical residency bridging
 program; loan assistance; encouraging the practice of obstetrics and
 gynecology in medically underserved areas; establishing the OBGYN
 medical loan repayment fund and the *OBGYN medical residency bridging fund;* amending K.S.A. 76-381, 76-383, 76-385 and 76-387
 and repealing the existing sections; also repealing K.S.A. 76-386a.

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9 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. K.S.A. 76-381 is hereby amended to read as follows: 76-381. As used in K.S.A. 76-380 through 76-386, and amendments thereto:

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(a) "Act" means the medical student loan act;

(b) "approved postgraduate residency training program" means a
residency training program in general pediatrics, general internal
medicine, family medicine, family practice, emergency medicine, *obstetrics and gynecology*, general psychiatry, child psychiatry or
fellowship training in geriatric medicine;

18 "service commitment area" means: (1) Any community within any (c) 19 county in Kansas other than Douglas, Johnson, Sedgwick, Shawnee or 20 Wyandotte county; (2) any state medical care facility or institution; (3) any 21 medical center operated by the veterans administration of the United 22 States; (4) the full-time faculty of the university of Kansas school of 23 medicine in family medicine, family practice, general psychiatry or child 24 psychiatry if serving as full-time faculty as provided in K.S.A. 76-384(c). 25 and amendments thereto; or (5) any community within Wyandotte county 26 for purposes of any practice obligation under an agreement entered into by 27 a person who is enrolled for the first time after July 1, 2004, in a course of 28 study leading to the medical degree; and

29 (d) "state medical care facility or institution" includes, but is not 30 limited to, the Kansas state school for the visually handicapped, the 31 Kansas state school for the deaf, any institution under the secretary for 32 aging and disability services, as defined by K.S.A. 76-12a01, and 33 amendments thereto, any institution-under the commissioner of juvenilejustice as defined by K.S.A. 2019 Supp. 38-2302, and amendments 34 35 thereto, the Kansas soldiers' home, the Kansas veterans' home and any 36 correctional institution under the secretary of corrections, as defined by K.S.A. 75-5202, and amendments thereto, but shall not include any state
 educational institution under the state board of regents, as defined by
 K.S.A. 76-711, and amendments thereto, except as specifically provided
 by statute.

5 Sec. 2. K.S.A. 76-383 is hereby amended to read as follows: 76-383. 6 A medical student loan agreement entered into by the university of Kansas 7 school of medicine and an undergraduate student enrolled in or admitted to 8 the university of Kansas school of medicine in a course of instruction 9 leading to the degree of doctor of medicine for the purpose of receiving a 10 medical student loan under this act shall require that the person receiving 11 the loan:

(a) Complete the required course of instruction and receive the degree
 of doctor of medicine and apply for, enter and complete an approved
 postgraduate residency training program;

(b) apply for and obtain a license to practice medicine and surgery inKansas;

17 (c) except as otherwise provided in K.S.A. 76-384, and amendments 18 thereto, engage in the full-time practice of medicine and surgery for a 19 period of 12 months within a service commitment area, except as-20 otherwise provided in K.S.A. 76-384(c), and amendments thereto, for 21 service as a full-time faculty member of the university of Kansas school of 22 medicine in family medicine, family practice, general psychiatry or child 23 psychiatry;

(d) commence such full-time practice of medicine and surgery within
nine months after completion of an approved postgraduate residency
training program and licensure in a service commitment area and continue
such full-time practice in such service commitment area for a consecutive
period of months equal to the total number of months required under the
agreement;

(e) agree that the service commitment for each agreement entered into
under this act is in addition to the service commitment contained in any
other agreement-which *that* has been or may be entered into under this act
for the purpose of obtaining a medical student loan or under other
agreements for the purpose of obtaining scholarship aid;

(f) maintain records and make reports to the university of Kansas school of medicine to document the satisfaction of the obligation under such agreement to engage in the full-time practice of medicine and surgery within a service commitment area and to continue such full-time practice in such service commitment area for a consecutive period of months equal to the total number of months required under the agreement; and

(g) upon failure to satisfy an agreement to engage in the full-time
practice of medicine and surgery within a service commitment area for the
required period of time under any such agreement, the person receiving a

medical student loan under this act shall repay amounts to the university of
 Kansas school of medicine as provided in K.S.A. 76-385, and amendments
 thereto.

4 Sec. 3. K.S.A. 76-385 is hereby amended to read as follows: 76-385. 5 (a) (1) Except as otherwise provided in paragraphs (2), (3), (4) and (5) 6 through (6) or in K.S.A. 76-386, and amendments thereto, upon the failure 7 of any person to satisfy the obligation to engage in the full-time practice of 8 medicine and surgery within a service commitment area of this state for 9 the required period of time under any medical student loan agreement 10 entered into under this act, such person shall repay to the university of Kansas school of medicine in accordance with subsection (b) an amount 11 12 equal to the total of: (A) The amount of money received by such person pursuant to such agreement, or the amount of money determined under 13 14 rules and regulations of the university of Kansas; plus (B) annual interest 15 at a rate of 15% from the date such money was received.

16 (2) Any person who fails to apply for and enter an approved 17 postgraduate residency training program shall be required to repay all moneys received pursuant to an agreement entered into for any such 18 19 medical student loan, plus accumulated interest at an annual rate of 15% 20 and shall commence such repayment in accordance with subsection (b) 21 within 90 days of graduation from the school of medicine or upon 22 termination or completion of a residency training program which does not 23 comply with the provisions of this act, whichever is later.

24 (3) If at any time a person is failing to satisfy an obligation to engage 25 in the full-time practice of medicine and surgery in Kansas for the required 26 period of time under an agreement entered into under this act because such 27 person is engaged in the full-time practice of medicine and surgery in a 28 state other than Kansas, or within Kansas in an area that is not a service 29 commitment area or in the practice of medicine and surgery which does 30 not otherwise comply with the agreement entered into under this act, and if 31 such person is subject to or currently making repayments under this 32 section and if such person subsequently commences the practice of medicine and surgery in this state which is in a service commitment area 33 34 or which otherwise complies with the agreement entered into under this 35 act, the balance of the repayment amount, including interest thereon, from 36 the time of such commencement of practice until the obligation of such 37 person is satisfied, or until the time such person again becomes subject to 38 repayments, shall be waived. All repayment amounts due prior to such 39 commencement of practice, including interest thereon, shall continue to be 40 payable as provided in this section. If subsequent to such commencement 41 of practice, the person fails to satisfy such obligation, the person again 42 shall be subject to repayments, including interest thereon, as otherwise 43 provided in this section.

1 (4) If, during the time a person is satisfying the service requirement 2 of an agreement entered into under this act, such person desires to engage 3 in less than the full-time practice of medicine and surgery within a service 4 commitment area of the state and remain in satisfaction of such service requirement, such person may make application to the chancellor of the 5 6 university of Kansas or the designee of the chancellor for permission to 7 engage in less than such full-time practice of medicine and surgery. Upon 8 a finding of exceptional circumstances made by the chancellor of the 9 university of Kansas, or the designee of the chancellor, such person may be authorized to engage in less than the full-time practice of medicine and 10 surgery within a service commitment area of the state for the remaining 11 12 required period of time under such agreement and for an additional period of time which shall be equal to the length of the originally required period 13 14 of time multiplied by the decimal fraction which is equal to the reduction 15 of the full-time practice of medicine and surgery to be authorized 16 hereunder, multiplied by two. In any such determination of the period 17 required to be engaged in the less than full-time practice of medicine and 18 surgery, the decimal fraction utilized shall not exceed 0.5 and any person 19 granted permission to engage in less than the full-time practice of 20 medicine and surgery in accordance with the provisions of this paragraph 21 shall be required to engage in at least the half-time practice of medicine 22 and surgery.

23 (5) Any person who enters but fails to complete an approved 24 postgraduate residency training program, or who enters and completes an 25 approved postgraduate residency training program but fails to satisfy the 26 obligation to engage in the full-time practice of medicine and surgery 27 within a service commitment area of this state for the required period of 28 time shall be required to repay all money received pursuant to an 29 agreement entered into under this act-a for any such medical student loan, 30 plus accumulated interest at an annual rate of 15% and shall commence 31 such repayment in accordance with subsection (b) within 90 days of failure 32 to complete an approved postgraduate residency training program or 90 33 days of failure to commence qualifying practice, whichever occurs first.

34 (6) For any person who entered and completed an approved 35 postgraduate residency training program in obstetrics and gynecology, if 36 during the time such person is satisfying the service requirement of an 37 agreement entered into pursuant to this act, such person is employed by, 38 provides services at or establishes any clinic or facility as such terms are 39 defined in K.S.A. 65-4a01, and amendments thereto, or performs or 40 induces, or attempts to perform or induce, an abortion, except in the case 41 of a medical emergency as defined in K.S.A. 65-6701, and amendments thereto, such person shall be deemed to have failed to complete such 42 43 person's service requirement and shall be required to repay all money

received pursuant to an agreement entered into under this act for any such
 medical student loan, plus accumulated interest at an annual rate of 15%,
 and shall commence such repayment in accordance with subsection (b).

(b) For any repayment requirement under this section, the person
shall repay an amount totaling the entire amount to be repaid under all
such agreements for which such obligations are not satisfied, including all
amounts of interest at the rate prescribed. The repayment shall be made in
not more than 10 equal annual installment payments.

9 (c) All installment payments under this section shall commence six 10 months after the date of the action or circumstance that causes the failure of the person to satisfy the obligations of such agreements, as determined 11 12 by the university of Kansas school of medicine based upon the circumstances of each individual case. In all cases, if an installment 13 payment becomes 91 days overdue, the entire amount outstanding shall 14 15 become immediately due and payable, including all amounts of interest at 16 the rate prescribed.

17 (d) The total repayment obligation imposed under all agreements entered into under this act may be satisfied by the person who entered into 18 19 the agreements at any time prior to graduation from the university of 20 Kansas school of medicine by making a single lump-sum payment equal to 21 the total of: (1) The entire amount to be repaid under all such agreements 22 upon failure to satisfy the obligations under such agreements to practice in 23 Kansas; plus (2) all amounts of interest thereon at the rate prescribed to the 24 date of payment.

(e) The university of Kansas school of medicine shall remit all moneys received under this section to the state treasurer in accordance with the provisions of K.S.A. 75-4215, and amendments thereto. Upon receipt of each such remittance, the state treasurer shall deposit the entire amount in the state treasury to the credit of the medical loan repayment fund.

31 There is hereby created in the state treasury the medical loan (f) 32 repayment fund. All expenditures from the medical loan repayment fund 33 shall be for medical student loans under the medical student loan act and 34 for the expenses of administration of the medical student loan act and shall 35 be made in accordance with appropriation acts upon warrants of the 36 director of accounts and reports issued pursuant to vouchers approved by 37 the chancellor of the university of Kansas or by a person designated by the 38 chancellor, except that expenditures shall not be made from the medical 39 loan repayment fund for medical student loans for medical students who 40 intend to enter and complete an approved postgraduate residency training program in obstetrics and gynecology, general psychiatry or child 41 42 psychiatry. On the effective date of this act, the director of accounts and 43 reports shall transfer all moneys in the medical scholarship and loan

1 repayment fund to the medical loan repayment fund. On the effective date 2 of this act, all liabilities of the medical scholarship and loan repayment 3 fund are hereby imposed on the medical loan repayment fund and the 4 medical scholarship and loan repayment fund is hereby abolished. 5 Whenever the medical scholarship and loan repayment fund, or words of 6 like effect, is referred to or designated by any statute, contract or other 7 document, such reference or designation shall be deemed to apply to the 8 medical loan repayment fund.

9 (g) There is hereby established in the state treasury the psychiatry medical loan repayment fund. All moneys credited to the psychiatry 10 medical loan repayment fund shall be expended only for medical student 11 12 loans for general psychiatry or child psychiatry students under the medical student loan act and for the expenses of administration of the medical 13 14 student loan act associated with such students. All expenditures from the 15 psychiatry medical loan repayment fund shall be made in accordance with 16 appropriation acts upon warrants of the director of accounts and reports 17 issued pursuant to vouchers approved by the chancellor of the university of 18 Kansas or the chancellor's designee.

19 (h) There is hereby established in the state treasury the OBGYN 20 medical loan repayment fund. All moneys credited to the OBGYN medical 21 loan repayment fund shall be expended only for medical student loans for 22 medical students who intend to enter and complete an approved 23 postgraduate residency training program in obstetrics and gynecology 24 under the medical student loan act and for the expenses of administration 25 of the medical student loan act associated with such students. All 26 expenditures from the OBGYN medical loan repayment fund shall be made 27 in accordance with appropriation acts upon warrants of the director of 28 accounts and reports issued pursuant to vouchers approved by the 29 chancellor of the university of Kansas or the chancellor's designee.

(h) Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, no
 moneys shall be transferred from the comprehensive grant program
 account of the state board of regents to the medical loan repayment fund,
 the OBGYN medical loan repayment fund or the psychiatry medical loan
 repayment fund or expended for any purposes related thereto.

Sec. 4. K.S.A. 76-387 is hereby amended to read as follows: 76-387. (a) (1) There is hereby established the Kansas medical residency bridging program at the university of Kansas school of medicine, which shall be developed and implemented in order to provide encouragement, opportunities and incentives for persons in primary care or mental health eare to:

(A) Enter and complete medical residency training programs in
 general pediatrics, general internal medicine, family medicine, family
 practice, obstetrics and gynecology, general psychiatry or child psychiatry

that are operated by or affiliated with the university of Kansas school of 1 2 medicine or other such primary care or mental health care medical residency training program that is operated in Kansas and approved by the 3 state board of healing arts; and a person under subsection (i) to 4

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(B) locate their medical practice in rural Kansas communities upon 6 completion of such residency training.

7 (2) The Kansas medical residency bridging program shall be administered by the institute for rural health care of the university of 8 9 Kansas school of medicine.

(b) Subject to the provisions of appropriation acts, the university of 10 Kansas school of medicine may enter into residency bridging loan 11 agreements, in accordance with the provisions of this section: (A) with any 12 person who has completed the first year of a primary care or mental health 13 eare medical residency training program in general pediatrics, general 14 15 internal medicine, family medicine, family practice, obstetrics and gynecology, general psychiatry or child psychiatry that is operated by or 16 17 affiliated with the university of Kansas school of medicine or other such primary care or mental health care *medical* residency training program that 18 19 is operated in Kansas and approved by the state board of healing arts; and 20 (B) with a person under subsection (i).

21 (c) Subject to the provisions of appropriation acts, each person 22 entering into a residency bridging loan agreement under this section shall 23 receive a payment of \$5,000 each year of primary care or mental health eare *medical* residency training, or any part of a year of such training, after 24 the date that the residency bridging loan agreement is entered into by the 25 resident and the university of Kansas school of medicine and, upon 26 completion of the primary care or mental health care medical residency 27 28 training program, a payment of \$6,000.

(d) Each residency bridging loan agreement shall require that the 29 30 person receiving the loan:

(1) Complete the primary care or mental health care medical 31 32 residency training program;

(2) engage in the full-time practice of medicine and surgery in any 33 county in Kansas other than Douglas, Johnson, Sedgwick, Shawnee or 34 35 Wyandotte for three years under a practice commitment agreement;

(3) commence such full-time practice of medicine and surgery within 36 37 90 days after completing the primary care or mental health care medical 38 residency training program; and

39 (4) upon failure to satisfy the obligation to engage in the full-time practice of medicine and surgery in accordance with the provisions of the 40 41 residency bridging loan agreement and this section, the person receiving the loan under this section shall repay to the university of Kansas school of 42 43 medicine, within 90 days of such failure, the amount equal to the amount

of-money moneys received by such person from the university of Kansas
 school of medicine, less credits earned, under such agreement plus interest
 at the annual rate of 15% from the date such-money was moneys were
 received.

5 (e) An obligation to engage in the practice of medicine and surgery in 6 accordance with the provisions of a residency bridging loan agreement and 7 this section shall be postponed during: (1) Any period of temporary 8 medical disability during which the person obligated is unable to practice 9 medicine and surgery because of such medical disability; or (2) any other 10 period of postponement agreed to or determined in accordance with 11 criteria agreed to in the practice commitment agreement.

(f) *Except as otherwise provided in subsection (g),* an obligation to engage in the practice of medicine and surgery in accordance with the provisions of a residency bridging loan agreement and this section shall be satisfied: (1) If the obligation to engage in the practice of medicine and surgery in accordance with such agreement has been completed; (2) if the person obligated dies; or (3) if, because of permanent physical disability, the person obligated is unable to practice medicine and surgery.

19 (g) For any person that completed a medical residency training program in obstetrics and gynecology pursuant to this section, such 20 21 person's obligation to engage in the practice of medicine and surgery in 22 accordance with the provisions of a residency bridging loan agreement and this section shall be deemed to not be satisfied if such person is 23 24 employed by, provides services at or establishes any clinic or facility as 25 such terms are defined in K.S.A. 65-4a01, and amendments thereto, or performs or induces, or attempts to perform or induce, an abortion, except 26 27 in the case of a medical emergency as defined in K.S.A. 65-6701, and 28 amendments thereto, at any time in which such person is obligated to 29 satisfy the provisions of such person's loan agreement made pursuant to 30 this section.

31 (g)(h) The university of Kansas school of medicine may adopt 32 additional provisions, requirements or conditions for participation in the 33 Kansas medical residency bridging program as are practicable and 34 appropriate to accomplish the purposes of the program or as may be 35 required for the implementation or administration of the program and, in 36 any case, as are not inconsistent with the provisions of this section or the 37 provisions of appropriation acts.

(h)(i) As used in this section, "practice commitment agreement"
 means an agreement to commence the full-time practice of medicine and
 surgery in a city located in any county in Kansas other than Douglas,
 Johnson, Sedgwick, Shawnee or Wyandotte county, that:

42 (1) Was entered into: (A) by a person in a primary care or mental 43 health care *medical* residency training program in general pediatrics, 1 general internal medicine, family medicine, family practice, *obstetrics and* 2 gynecology, general psychiatry or child psychiatry, that is operated by or affiliated with the university of Kansas school of medicine or other such 3 4 primary care or mental health care *medical* residency training program that 5 is operated in Kansas and approved by the state board of healing arts; or 6 (B) by a person under subsection (i), with the city where such practice is to 7 commence or another contracting entity other than the university of 8 Kansas school of medicine that is representative of the interests of such 9 city; and

(2) provides benefits to such person that have an aggregate monetary
value equal to or greater than the aggregate amount of payments to such
person from the university of Kansas school of medicine under a residency
bridging loan agreement under this section.

(i) A person who graduated from the university of Kansas school of
medicine prior to July 1, 1992, who has completed the first year of a
primary care residency training program in family practice which isoperated outside the state of Kansas and who has entered into a practice
commitment agreement with the north central Kansas health carefoundation is cligible to enter into a residency bridging loan agreementunder this section.

(j) Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, no moneys appropriated for the Kansas medical residency bridging program at the university of Kansas school of medicine, except moneys appropriated to the *OBGYN medical residency bridging fund or the* rural health bridging psychiatry fund, shall be expended for residency bridging loan agreements for medical residents training in general psychiatry or child psychiatry.

(k) Subject to appropriations, the university of Kansas school of
 medicine shall enter into residency bridging loan agreements with three
 medical residents training in general psychiatry or child psychiatry.

31 There is hereby established in the state treasury the rural health (1)32 bridging psychiatry fund. All moneys credited to the rural health bridging 33 psychiatry fund shall be used only for purposes related to residency bridging loan agreements for medical residents training in general 34 35 psychiatry or child psychiatry pursuant to K.S.A. 76-387, and amendments 36 thereto this section. All expenditures from the rural health bridging 37 psychiatry fund shall be made in accordance with appropriation acts upon 38 warrants of the director of accounts and reports issued pursuant to 39 vouchers approved by the chancellor of the university of Kansas or the 40 chancellor's designee.

(m) There is hereby established in the state treasury the OBGYN
medical residency bridging fund. All moneys credited to the OBGYN
medical residency bridging fund shall be used only for purposes related to

residency bridging loan agreements for medical residents training in
 obstetrics and gynecology pursuant to this section. All expenditures from
 the OBGYN medical residency bridging fund shall be made in accordance
 with appropriation acts upon warrants of the director of accounts and
 reports issued pursuant to vouchers approved by the chancellor of the
 university of Kansas or the chancellor's designee.

7 (m)(n) Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, no 8 moneys shall be transferred from the comprehensive grant program 9 account of the state board of regents to the rural health bridging psychiatry 10 fund or expended for any purposes related to the Kansas medical residency 11 bridging program.

12 Sec. 5. K.S.A. 76-381, 76-383, 76-385, 76-386a and 76-387 are 13 hereby repealed.

14 Sec. 6. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its 15 publication in the statute book.
