AN ACT concerning motor vehicles; relating to distinctive license plates;
 providing for the American legion, knights of Columbus and proud
 educator license plates; providing for lowered license plate
 commitments and costs prior to production of plates; *allowing additional license plates issued by the division of vehicles to be personalized license plates;* amending K.S.A. 2019 Supp. *8-132,* 8 1,141 and 8-1,142 and repealing the existing sections.

9 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

10 New Section 1. (a) On and after January 1, 2021, any owner or lessee 11 of one or more passenger vehicles or trucks registered for a gross weight 12 of 20,000 pounds or less, who is a resident of Kansas, upon compliance with the provisions of this section, may be issued one American legion 13 14 license plate for each such passenger vehicle or truck. Such license plates shall be issued for the same time as other license plates upon proper 15 registration and payment of the regular license fee as provided in K.S.A. 8-16 143, and amendments thereto, and either the payment to the county 17 18 treasurer of the logo use royalty payment or the presentation of the annual 19 logo use authorization statement provided for in subsection (b).

(b) The American legion may authorize the use of the organization's logo to be affixed on license plates as provided by this section. Any motor vehicle owner or lessee may apply annually to the American legion for use of such logo. Such owner or lessee shall pay an amount of not less than \$25 nor more than \$100 to the American legion as a logo use royalty payment for each such license plate to be issued. The logo use royalty payment shall be paid to either:

(1) The American legion, who shall issue to the motor vehicle owner
or lessee, without further charge, a logo use authorization statement that
shall be presented by the motor vehicle owner or lessee at the time of
registration; or

(2) the county treasurer.

(c) Any applicant for a license plate authorized by this section may make application for such license plate not less than 60 days prior to such person's renewal of registration date, on a form prescribed and furnished by the director of vehicles, and any applicant for such license plate shall either provide the annual logo use authorization statement provided for in 1 subsection (b) or pay to the county treasurer the logo use royalty payment.

Application for registration of a passenger vehicle or truck and issuance of
the license plate under this section shall be made by the owner or lessee in
a manner prescribed by the director of vehicles upon forms furnished by
the director.

6 (d) No registration or license plate issued under this section shall be 7 transferable to any other person.

8 (e) The director of vehicles may transfer an American legion license 9 plate from a leased vehicle to a purchased vehicle.

10 (f) Renewals of registration under this section shall be made annually, upon payment of the fee prescribed in subsection (a), in the manner 11 12 prescribed in K.S.A. 8-132(b), and amendments thereto. No renewal of 13 registration shall be made to any applicant until such applicant provides to the county treasurer either the annual logo use authorization statement 14 15 provided for in subsection (b) or the payment of the annual royalty 16 payment. If such statement is not presented at the time of registration or 17 faxed by the American legion, or the annual royalty payment is not made to the county treasurer, the applicant shall be required to comply with the 18 19 provisions of K.S.A. 8-143, and amendments thereto, and return the 20 license plate to the county treasurer of such person's residence.

(g) The American legion shall provide to all county treasurers an electronic mail address where applicants can contact the American legion for information concerning the application process or the status of such applicant's license plate application.

(h) The American legion, with the approval of the director of
 vehicles, shall design a plate to be issued under the provisions of this
 section.

(i) As a condition of receiving the American legion license plate and
any subsequent registration renewal of such license plate, the applicant
shall consent to the division authorizing the division's release of motor
vehicle record information, including the applicant's name, address,
royalty payment amount, plate number and vehicle type to the American
legion and the state treasurer.

(j) The collection and remittance of annual royalty payments by the
county treasurer shall be subject to the provisions of K.S.A. 8-1,141(h),
and amendments thereto.

New Sec. 2. (a) On and after January 1, 2021, any owner or lessee of one or more passenger vehicles or trucks registered for a gross weight of 20,000 pounds or less, who is a resident of Kansas, upon compliance with the provisions of this section, may be issued one knights of Columbus license plate for each such passenger vehicle or truck. Such license plates shall be issued for the same time as other license plates upon proper registration and payment of the regular license fee as provided in K.S.A. 8143, and amendments thereto, and either the payment to the county
 treasurer of the logo use royalty payment or the presentation of the annual
 logo use authorization statement provided for in subsection (b).

4 (b) The knights of Columbus may authorize the use of the organization's logo to be affixed on license plates as provided by this section. Any motor vehicle owner or lessee may apply annually to the knights of Columbus for use of such logo. Such owner or lessee shall pay an amount of not less than \$25 nor more than \$100 to the knights of Columbus as a logo use royalty payment for each such license plate to be issued. The logo use royalty payment shall be paid to either:

(1) The knights of Columbus, who shall issue to the motor vehicle
owner or lessee, without further charge, a logo use authorization statement
that shall be presented by the motor vehicle owner or lessee at the time of
registration; or

(2) the county treasurer.

16 Any applicant for a license plate authorized by this section may (c) 17 make application for such license plate not less than 60 days prior to such 18 person's renewal of registration date, on a form prescribed and furnished by the director of vehicles, and any applicant for such license plate shall 19 20 either provide the annual logo use authorization statement provided for in 21 subsection (b) or pay to the county treasurer the logo use royalty payment. 22 Application for registration of a passenger vehicle or truck and issuance of 23 the license plate under this section shall be made by the owner or lessee in 24 a manner prescribed by the director of vehicles upon forms furnished by 25 the director.

26 (d) No registration or license plate issued under this section shall be27 transferable to any other person.

(e) The director of vehicles may transfer a knights of Columbuslicense plate from a leased vehicle to a purchased vehicle.

30 (f) Renewals of registration under this section shall be made annually, 31 upon payment of the fee prescribed in subsection (a), in the manner 32 prescribed in K.S.A. 8-132(b), and amendments thereto. No renewal of 33 registration shall be made to any applicant until such applicant provides to 34 the county treasurer either the annual logo use authorization statement 35 provided for in subsection (b) or the payment of the annual royalty 36 payment. If such statement is not presented at the time of registration or 37 faxed by the knights of Columbus, or the annual royalty payment is not 38 made to the county treasurer, the applicant shall be required to comply 39 with the provisions of K.S.A. 8-143, and amendments thereto, and return 40 the license plate to the county treasurer of such person's residence.

(g) The knights of Columbus shall provide to all county treasurers an
electronic mail address where applicants can contact the knights of
Columbus for information concerning the application process or the status

1 of such applicant's license plate application.

2 (h) The knights of Columbus, with the approval of the director of 3 vehicles, shall design a plate to be issued under the provisions of this 4 section.

5 (i) As a condition of receiving the knights of Columbus license plate 6 and any subsequent registration renewal of such license plate, the applicant 7 shall consent to the division authorizing the division's release of motor 8 vehicle record information, including the applicant's name, address, 9 royalty payment amount, plate number and vehicle type to the knights of 10 Columbus and the state treasurer.

(j) The collection and remittance of annual royalty payments by the
county treasurer shall be subject to the provisions of K.S.A. 8-1,141(h),
and amendments thereto.

14 New Sec 3 (a) On and after January 1, 2021, any owner or lessee of 15 one or more passenger vehicles or trucks registered for a gross weight of 20,000 pounds or less, who is a resident of Kansas, upon compliance with 16 17 the provisions of this section, may be issued one proud educator license 18 plate for each such passenger vehicle or truck. Such license plates shall be 19 issued for the same time as other license plates upon proper registration 20 and payment of the regular license fee as provided in K.S.A. 8-143, and 21 amendments thereto, and either the payment to the county treasurer of the 22 logo use royalty payment or the presentation of the annual logo use 23 authorization statement provided for in subsection (b).

24 (b) The Kansas educators support foundation may authorize the use 25 of the organization's logo to be affixed on license plates as provided by this section. Any motor vehicle owner or lessee may apply annually to the 26 27 Kansas educators support foundation for use of such logo. Such owner or 28 lessee shall pay an amount of not less than \$25 nor more than \$100 to the 29 Kansas educators support foundation as a logo use royalty payment for 30 each such license plate to be issued. The logo use royalty payment shall be 31 paid to either:

(1) The Kansas educators support foundation, who shall issue to the
 motor vehicle owner or lessee, without further charge, a logo use
 authorization statement that shall be presented by the motor vehicle owner
 or lessee at the time of registration; or

(2) the county treasurer.

(c) Any applicant for a license plate authorized by this section may
make application for such license plate not less than 60 days prior to such
person's renewal of registration date, on a form prescribed and furnished
by the director of vehicles, and any applicant for such license plate shall
either provide the annual logo use authorization statement provided for in
subsection (b) or pay to the county treasurer the logo use royalty payment.
Application for registration of a passenger vehicle or truck and issuance of

the license plate under this section shall be made by the owner or lessee in
 a manner prescribed by the director of vehicles upon forms furnished by
 the director.

4 (d) No registration or license plate issued under this section shall be 5 transferable to any other person.

6 (e) The director of vehicles may transfer a proud educator license 7 plate from a leased vehicle to a purchased vehicle.

8 (f) Renewals of registration under this section shall be made annually, upon payment of the fee prescribed in subsection (a), in the manner 9 10 prescribed in K.S.A. 8-132(b), and amendments thereto. No renewal of registration shall be made to any applicant until such applicant provides to 11 12 the county treasurer either the annual logo use authorization statement 13 provided for in subsection (b) or the payment of the annual royalty payment. If such statement is not presented at the time of registration or 14 15 faxed by the Kansas educators support foundation, or the annual royalty 16 payment is not made to the county treasurer, the applicant shall be required 17 to comply with the provisions of K.S.A. 8-143, and amendments thereto, 18 and return the license plate to the county treasurer of such person's 19 residence.

(g) The Kansas educators support foundation shall provide to all
county treasurers an electronic mail address where applicants can contact
the Kansas educators support foundation for information concerning the
application process or the status of such applicant's license plate
application.

(h) The Kansas educators support foundation, with the approval of
 the director of vehicles, shall design a plate to be issued under the
 provisions of this section.

(i) As a condition of receiving the proud educator license plate and
any subsequent registration renewal of such license plate, the applicant
shall consent to the division authorizing the division's release of motor
vehicle record information, including the applicant's name, address,
royalty payment amount, plate number and vehicle type to the Kansas
educators support foundation and the state treasurer.

(j) The collection and remittance of annual royalty payments by the
county treasurer shall be subject to the provisions of K.S.A. 8-1,141(h),
and amendments thereto.

Sec. 4. K.S.A. 2019 Supp. 8-1,141 is hereby amended to read as follows: 8-1,141. (a) Any new distinctive license plate authorized for issuance on and after July 1, 1994, shall be subject to the personalized license plate fee prescribed by K.S.A. 8-132(c), and amendments thereto. This section shall not apply to any distinctive license plate authorized prior to July 1, 1994.

43 (b) The director of vehicles shall not issue any new distinctive license

plate authorized for issuance on and after July 1, 1995, unless there is a
 guarantee of an initial issuance of at least 500 license plates.

3 (c) The provisions of this section shall not apply to distinctive license
4 plates issued under the provisions of K.S.A. 8-1,145, *and amendments*5 *thereto*, or K.S.A. 2019 Supp. 8-177d, 8-1,163, 8-1,166, 8-1,185, 8-1,186,
6 8-1,187 or 8-1,188, and amendments thereto.

7 (d) The provisions of subsection (a), shall not apply to distinctive 8 license plates issued under the provisions of K.S.A. 8-1,146 or 8-1,148, 9 and amendments thereto, or K.S.A. 2019 Supp. 8-1,153, 8-1,158 or 8-1,161, and amendments thereto.

(e) The provisions of subsection (f) shall not apply to distinctive 11 12 license plates issued under the provisions of K.S.A. 2019 Supp. 8-1,160 13 and 8-1,183, and amendments thereto, except that the division shall delay the manufacturing and issuance of such distinctive license plate until the 14 15 division has received not-less fewer than 1,000 100 orders for such plate, 16 including payment of the personalized license plate fee required under 17 subsection (a). Upon certification by the director of vehicles to the director 18 of accounts and reports that not-less fewer than 1,000 100 paid orders for 19 such plate have been received, the director of accounts and reports shall 20 transfer \$40,000 \$4,000 from the state highway fund to the distinctive 21 license plate fund.

(f) (1) Any person or organization sponsoring any distinctive license
plate authorized by the legislature on and after July 1, 2004, shall submit
to the division of vehicles a nonrefundable amount not to exceed \$20,000,
\$5,000 to defray the division's cost for developing such distinctive license
plate.

27 (2) All moneys received under this subsection shall be remitted by the 28 secretary of revenue to the state treasurer in accordance with the 29 provisions of K.S.A. 75-4215, and amendments thereto. Upon receipt of 30 each such remittance, the state treasurer shall deposit the entire amount in 31 the state treasury to the credit of the distinctive license plate fund which is hereby created in the state treasury. All moneys credited to the distinctive 32 33 license plate fund shall be used by the department of revenue only for the 34 purpose associated with the development of distinctive license plates. All 35 expenditures from the distinctive license plate application fee fund shall be 36 made in accordance with appropriation acts, upon warrants of the director 37 of accounts and reports issued pursuant to vouchers approved by the 38 secretary of the department of revenue.

(g) (1) Except for educational institution license plates issued under
K.S.A. 8-1,142, and amendments thereto, the director of vehicles shall
discontinue the issuance of any distinctive license plate authorized prior to
July 1, 2004, and which that is subject to the provisions of subsection (b)
if:

1 (A) Less than 500 license plates, including annual renewals, are-2 issued for that distinctive license plate by July 1, 2006; and

3 (B) less *fewer* than 250 license plates, including annual renewals, are 4 issued for that distinctive license plate during any subsequent two-year 5 period after July 1, 2006.

6 (2) The director of vehicles shall discontinue the issuance of any 7 distinctive license plate authorized on and after July 1, 2004, if:

8 (A) LessFewer than 500 plates, including annual renewals, are issued 9 for that distinctive license plate by the end of the second year of sales; and

10 (B) lessfewer than 250 license plates, including annual renewals, are 11 issued for that distinctive license plate during any subsequent two-year 12 period.

13 (h) An application for any distinctive license plate issued after December 31, 2012, and the *a* corresponding royalty fee *payment* may be 14 collected either by the county treasurer or the entity benefiting from the 15 16 issuance of the distinctive license plate. Annual royalty payments collected 17 by the county treasurers shall be remitted to the state treasurer in 18 accordance with the provisions of K.S.A. 75-4215, and amendments 19 thereto. Upon receipt of each such remittance the state treasurer shall 20 deposit the entire amount in the state treasury to the credit of a segregated 21 royalty fund which shall be administered by the state treasurer. All 22 expenditures from the royalty fund shall be made in accordance with 23 appropriation acts upon warrants of the director of accounts and reports 24 issued pursuant to vouchers approved by the state treasurer or the state 25 treasurer's designee. Payments from the royalty fund shall be made to the entity benefiting from the issuance of the distinctive license plate on a 26 27 monthly basis.

(i) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, for any distinctive
 license plate, the division shall produce such distinctive license plate for a
 motorcycle upon request to the division by the organization sponsoring the
 distinctive license plate.

(j) In addition to any residency requirements for all distinctive license plates, any person not a resident of Kansas, serving as a member of the armed forces stationed in this state shall be eligible to apply for any distinctive license plate as if the individual was a resident of this state. Such person shall be eligible to renew the distinctive license plate registration as long as the person is still stationed in this state at the time the registration is renewed.

Sec. 5. K.S.A. 2019 Supp. 8-1,142 is hereby amended to read as
follows: 8-1,142. (a) As used in this section, "educational institution"
means:

42 (1) Any state educational institution under the control and supervision43 of the state board of regents;

(2) any municipal university;

(3) any not-for-profit independent institution of higher education
which *that* is accredited by the north central association of colleges and
secondary schools accrediting agency based on its requirements as of April
1, 1985, is operated independently and not controlled or administered by
the state or any agency or subdivision thereof, maintains open enrollment
and the main campus or principal place of operation of which is located in
Kansas;

9 (4) any community college organized and operating under the laws of 10 this state; and

(5) Haskell Indian Nations university.

12 (b) Any owner or lessee of one or more passenger vehicles, trucks registered for a gross weight of not more than 20,000 pounds or 13 motorcycles, who is a resident of Kansas, upon compliance with the 14 provisions of this section, may be issued one educational institution license 15 16 plate for each such passenger vehicle, truck or motorcycle. Such license 17 plates shall be issued for the same period of time as other license plates 18 upon proper registration and payment of the regular license fee as provided 19 in K.S.A. 8-143, and amendments thereto, plus the payment of an 20 additional fee of \$5 for each plate, and either the payment to the county 21 treasurer of the logo use royalty payment-established by the alumni-22 association or foundation or the presentation of the annual emblem use 23 authorization statement provided for in subsection (c).

24 (c) Any educational institution may authorize through its officially 25 recognized alumni association or foundation the use of such institution's 26 official emblems to be affixed on license plates as provided by this section. 27 Any royalty payment derived from this section, except reasonable 28 administrative costs, shall be used for recognition of academic 29 achievement or excellence subject to the approval of the chancellor or 30 president of the educational institution. Any motor vehicle owner or lessee 31 may annually apply to the alumni association or foundation for the use of 32 the institution's emblems. Upon annual application and payment to either: 33 (1) The alumni association or foundation in an amount of not less than \$25 34 nor more than \$100 as an emblem use royalty payment for each 35 educational institution license plate to be issued, the alumni association or 36 foundation shall issue to the motor vehicle owner or lessee, without further 37 charge, an emblem use authorization statement, which shall be presented 38 by the motor vehicle owner or lessee at the time of registration; or (2) the 39 county treasurer of the logo use royalty payment for each license plate to 40 be issued.

(d) Any applicant for an educational institution license plate may
make application for such plates not less than 60 days prior to such
person's renewal of registration date, on a form prescribed and furnished

1 by the director of vehicles, and any applicant for the educational institution

2 license plates shall provide either the annual emblem use authorization 3 statement provided for in subsection (c) or pay to the county treasurer the 4 logo use royalty payment established by the alumni association or 5 foundation. Application for registration of a passenger vehicle, truck or 6 motorcycle and issuance of the license plates under this section shall be 7 made by the owner or lessee in a manner prescribed by the director of 8 vehicles upon forms furnished by the director.

9 (e) No registration or educational institution license plate issued 10 under this section shall be transferable to any other person.

(f) The director of vehicles may transfer educational institutionlicense plates from a leased vehicle to a purchased vehicle.

13 (g) Renewals of registration under this section shall be made annually, upon payment of the fee prescribed in subsection (b), in the 14 15 manner prescribed in subsection (b) of K.S.A. 8-132(b), and amendments thereto. No renewal of registration shall be made to any applicant until 16 17 such applicant provides to the county treasurer either the annual emblem use authorization statement provided for in subsection (c) or the payment 18 19 of the annual emblem use royalty payment-established by the alumniassociation or foundation. If such emblem use authorization statement is 20 21 not presented at the time of registration or faxed by the alumni association 22 or foundations, or the annual emblem use royalty payment is not made to 23 the county treasurer, the applicant shall be required to comply with K.S.A. 24 8-143, and amendments thereto, and return the educational institution 25 license plates to the county treasurer of such person's residence.

(h) The director of vehicles shall not issue any educational institution
license plates for any educational institution, unless such educational
institution's alumni association or foundation guarantees the initial
issuance of at least-500 100 license plates.

30 (i) The director of vehicles shall discontinue the issuance of an31 educational institution's license plate authorized under this section if:

(1) LessFewer than-500 100 educational institution license plates,
 including annual renewals, are issued for an educational institution by the
 end of the second year of sales; and

(2) lessfewer than 250 50 educational institution license plates,
 including annual renewals, are issued for an educational institution during
 any subsequent two-year period.

38 (j) Each educational institution's alumni association or foundation39 shall:

40 (1) Pay the initial cost of silk-screening for such educational license 41 plates; and

42 (2) provide to all county treasurers a toll-free telephone number 43 where applicants can call the alumni association or foundation for information concerning the application process or the status of their
 license plate application.

3 (k) Each educational institution's alumni association or foundation, 4 with the approval of the director of vehicles and subject to the availability 5 of materials and equipment, shall design a license plate to be issued under 6 the provisions of this section.

(1) As a condition of receiving the educational institution license plate
and any subsequent registration renewal of such plate, the applicant must
provide consent to the division authorizing the division's release of motor
vehicle record information, including the applicant's name, address,
emblem use royalty payment amount, plate number and vehicle type to the
relevant educational institution and the state treasurer.

(m) Annual royalty payments collected by county treasurers under 13 14 this section shall be remitted to the state treasurer in accordance with the provisions of K.S.A. 75-4215, and amendments thereto. In the case of an 15 16 educational institution that is a state educational institution as defined by K.S.A. 76-711, and amendments thereto, upon receipt of each such 17 18 remittance, the state treasurer shall deposit the entire amount in the state 19 treasury to the credit of the appropriate account of the restricted fees fund 20 of such state educational institution. In the case of an educational 21 institution which is not a state educational institution as defined by K.S.A. 22 76-711, and amendments thereto, upon receipt of each such remittance, the 23 state treasurer shall remit the entire amount to the educational institutions 24 emblem royalty fund, which is hereby created in the state treasury and 25 shall be administered by the state treasurer. All expenditures from the educational institutions emblem royalty fund shall be made in accordance 26 27 with appropriation acts upon warrants of the director of accounts and 28 reports issued pursuant to vouchers approved by the state treasurer or the 29 state treasurer's designee. Payments from the educational institutions 30 emblem royalty fund to the respective educational institutions shall be 31 made on a monthly basis.

32 K.S.A. 2019 Supp. 8-132 is hereby amended to read as Sec. 6. 33 follows: 8-132. (a) (1) Subject to the provisions of this section and K.S.A. 8-1,125, and amendments thereto, the division of vehicles shall furnish 34 35 to every owner whose vehicle shall be registered one license plate for 36 such vehicle. Such license plate shall have displayed on it the 37 registration number assigned to the vehicle and to the owner thereof, the 38 name of the state, which may be abbreviated, and the year or years for 39 which it is issued. The same type of license plates shall be issued for passenger motor vehicles, rented without a driver, as are issued for 40 41 private passenger vehicles.

42 (2) Any license plate issued pursuant to subsections (a) or (b) may be 43 a personalized license plate subject to the provisions of subsection (c), SB 383—Am. by SC

1 *including the payment of the additional fee.*

(b) During calendar year 1975 commencing on the effective date of 2 this act, and during every fifth calendar year thereafter, the division of 3 vehicles shall furnish one license plate for any type of vehicle an owner 4 registers or has the registration thereof renewed, but during the 5 6 succeeding four-year period following calendar year 1975 and during 7 the succeeding four-year period following every fifth calendar year subsequent to 1975, the division of vehicles shall not furnish any license 8 plate for the renewal of a vehicle's registration. During calendar year 9 1976 and during each calendar year thereafter in which a license plate 10 is not issued for the renewal of registration of a vehicle, the division of 11 vehicles shall furnish one decal for the license plate issued for a vehicle 12 as provided in K.S.A. 8-134, and amendments thereto, for each 13 registration and renewal of registration of such vehicle. Notwithstanding 14 the foregoing provisions of this subsection, whenever, in the discretion 15 of the director of vehicles, it is determined that the license plates 16 currently being issued and displayed are not deteriorating to the extent 17 that their replacement is warranted, the director may adopt rules and 18 19 regulations to extend the five-year issuance cycle provided for in this 20 subsection by one year at a time, and in the same manner the director 21 may further extend such cycle by one year at a time, successively as the director determines appropriate. If the cycle is extended at the expiration 22 23 of the extended term, new license plates shall again be issued in the manner and for the term provided in such rules and regulations, except 24 25 that the owner of a motor vehicle currently registered may continue to display the license plate currently being issued and displayed for a 26 period not to exceed three registration years from the date of the 27 expiration of the extended term. The division shall furnish one decal for 28 29 each such license plate in accordance with the provisions of this 30 subsection.

31 Two personalized license plates may be issued to any owner or (c) lessee of a passenger vehicle or a truck licensed for a gross weight of not 32 more than 20,000 pounds, who makes proper application to the division 33 of vehicles not less than 60 days prior to such owner's or lessee's 34 renewal of registration date. Such application shall be on a form 35 prescribed by the division and accompanied by a fee of \$40, which shall 36 37 be in addition to any other fee required to renew the registration of such 38 passenger vehicle under the laws of this state. One such personalized 39 license plate shall be displayed on the rear of the vehicle and, at the option of the owner or lessee, the other license plate may be displayed on 40 41 the front of the vehicle, except that no registration decal shall be issued pursuant to K.S.A. 8-134, and amendments thereto, for any such license 42 plate displayed on the front of such vehicle. One personalized license 43

plate may be issued to any owner of a motorcycle upon proper 1 application in the same manner provided in this subsection (c) for 2 passenger vehicles and trucks. The \$40 fee shall be paid only once 3 during the registration period for which such license plates were issued, 4 and any subsequent renewals during the registration period shall be 5 6 subject only to the registration fee prescribed by K.S.A. 8-143, and 7 amendments thereto. The division shall design distinctive, personalized license plates to be issued which shall contain not more than seven 8 letters or numbers on truck or passenger vehicle license plates and not 9 more than five letters or numbers on motorcycle license plates, or a 10 combination thereof, to be designated by the applicant in lieu of the 11 letters and numbers required by K.S.A. 8-147, and amendments thereto, 12 other than the letters required to designate the county in which such 13 vehicle is registered. Unless the letters or numbers designated by the 14 applicant have been assigned to another vehicle, or unless the letters or 15 16 numbers designated by the applicant have a profane, vulgar, lewd or 17 indecent meaning or connotation, as determined by the director of 18 vehicles, the division shall assign such letters or numbers to the 19 applicant's vehicle, and the letters or numbers, or combination thereof, 20 so assigned shall be deemed the registration number of such vehicle. 21 Subject to the foregoing provisions, all license plates issued under this 22 section shall be manufactured in accordance with K.S.A. 8-147, and 23 amendments thereto. Such license plates shall be issued for a registration period of five years commencing in 1985 and each five years 24 25 thereafter.

26 The secretary of revenue shall adopt rules and regulations necessary to carry out the provisions of this act, including, without limitation, rules 27 and regulations concerning: (1) The procedure for insuring that 28 duplicate license plates are not issued throughout the state; (2) the 29 procedure for reserving distinctive license plates for the purpose of 30 obtaining the same on each annual renewal of registration; (3) the 31 procedure for allowing the transfer of personalized license plates from 32 one vehicle to another for which such license plates were originally 33 issued, when the title to the original vehicle has not been transferred and 34 the name or names of the owner or owners listed on the titles to both 35 vehicles are identical; and (4) procedures necessary to coordinate this 36 37 act with other laws of this state governing registration of vehicles. The 38 director of vehicles shall remit all moneys received by the division of 39 vehicles under this section to the state treasurer in accordance with the provisions of K.S.A. 75-4215, and amendments thereto. Upon receipt of 40 41 each such remittance, the state treasurer shall deposit the entire amount in the state treasury to the credit of the state highway fund. 42
