Mr. Chairman and Members of the Committee:

This bill, HB 2462, edits a sentence in the statue for the requirements of a Kansas Legislator to be a member of the Joint-Committee of State-Tribal relations. Though I do not know the precise reasons why the statue says a member shall be selected only from the federal and state affairs, judiciary, taxation, and assessment and taxation, committees, I can only speculate that it was due to these committees having more contact with Tribal legislation.

Due to this statue, this created some issues last year during my first State-Tribal relations committee meeting. The Kansas Legislature had to swiftly pass a temporary approval for myself to be on the House Judiciary committee, so I was legally allowed to sit on my State-Tribal relations committee. I was not notified of this statue prior to the selection of my committees and due to my background in public health, my interest did not naturally gravitate towards those required committees. I see this being an issue for future representatives or senators who my fall into this similar obstacle and I am in support of eliminating this requirement.

Updating this statue eliminates a barrier for any future Native American Kansas Legislators who may have expertise needed else where besides these required committees. I ask the committee for their support in passing HB 2462 and I will stand for questions.
