House Budget Committee Written Testimony on HB 2511 Jennifer King Reid, USD #265 Assistant Principal/Athletic Director January 27, 2022

Committee Members,

My name is Jennifer King Reid and I have the privilege to serve Eisenhower Middle School in Goddard as the Assistant Principal and Athletic Director.

I am writing today to ask you not support HB 2511 for the following reasons.

- Our athletic, academic, and music opportunities offered to students are an extension of the
 diligent work done each and every day in the classroom. We have high standards, often
 exceeding the minimum requirements of KSHSAA for grades and behavior in order for students
 to participate in extracurricular activities. This is a natural way to hold students accountable and
 help them pursue post-secondary success.
- The ability for schools to maintain a standard of eligibility would be near impossible as there are
 vastly different requirements and oversight to public and private schools as there are to
 homeschools. Many schools have policies in place allowing homeschool students to participate
 in some capacity, provided they are in some way connected to a brick and mortar building in
 their district.
- Passage of this bill would not result in fairness and equity for students already attending KSHSAA member schools. Decisions on allowing homeschool students should remain in the hands of local school boards.
