Chair Williams and members of the committee:

I am a retired Kansas public school teacher. I worked for 38 years in the Shawnee Mission school district as did my husband. I am a passionate and enthusiastic supporter of PUBLIC education. I do not wish to discuss the merits or limitations of private education. The choice to attend private schools is personal to families who can afford such an option. It is our public schools that I wish to defend. These schools are open to all regardless of race, sex, religion or abilities. They do not limit who qualifies as a student. They are located in our neighborhoods and help keep our neighborhoods strong. The students attending public schools reflect the rich diversity of their communities. Money diverted to sustain private schools is money lost to strengthening staffing, instructional materials & special educational support for vulnerable children in public schools.
