Dear Kansas House Transportation Committee,

I am submitting this testimony in support of House Bill 2194 that supports the passage of legislation for an Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Incorporated License Plate for the State of Kansas. I am currently a member of the Alpha Iota Omega Chapter in Topeka, Kansas, and I am an Assistant Professor at the University of Kansas.
