Research: Financial Obligations Imposed on Youth can Increase Recidivism

- "The total amount of fines, fees, and/or restitution imposed at disposition and owed upon case closing as well as owing fines, fees, and/or restitution in general upon case closing all significantly increased the odds of a youth recidivating."
- "Importantly, these results hold even after controlling for relevant youth demo-graphics and case characteristics variables."
