As a retired, and longtime Director of Food Services in Kansas, I know the importance of focusing on less paperwork, instead concentrating on the subject at hand, which is to get nutritious food into the stomachs of our Kansas adults and children. Please don't add more paperwork to our hardworking agencies that are just trying to feed hungry people!
