Senate Bill 501 will cost the taxpayers of our state tens of millions of dollars, increasing our client's food insecurity. The states charitable food pantries are run by volunteers. We are still seeing record need after two years of the pandemic. The charitable sector is already overwhelmed and cannot meet all of the needs for our food insecure. This bill will not help poor Kansans, if fact they will be the ones who will be hurt the most by this bill.
