

Network Interconnection in Kansas



- No internet exchange points within Kansas; one of 17 states that does not have one
- Almost all of Kansas's internet traffic is backhauled to IXPs at 1102 Grand Blvd. in Kansas City or to 910 15th St. in Denver
- Cloud services and content streaming generally occurs from these cities
- Limited north-south connectivity through Wichita to Oklahoma
- Regional hub communities in Kansas (including Wichita) are not prepared for the future evolution of the internet where latency is as important as bandwidth

Regional Benefits of Internet Exchanges



- Physical home for cloud services & content delivery networks
- Facilitates direct peering between local ISPs, backhaul providers, Tier 1 carriers, CDNs
- Keep local traffic local that needs to stay local
- Significantly reduces latency
- Reduce wholesale IP transit costs for local ISPs through better competition
- Increase network resiliency for all tenants




