AN ACT concerning the legislative branch; requiring the state capitol and legislative meetings to be open to the public.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

- Section 1. (a) Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, the state capitol shall be open to the public between the hours of 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. on all weekdays, except on public holidays designated in K.S.A. 35-107, and amendments thereto.
- (b) Except as provided in subsection (c), all legislative meetings shall be open to the public and no restriction on the number of members of the public present in:
- (1) Any meeting room for any legislative committee shall limit the number of members of the public to fewer than 15 persons;
- (2) the gallery for the house of representatives shall limit the number of members of the public to fewer than 50 persons; or
- (3) the gallery for the senate shall limit the number of members of the public to fewer than 50 persons.
- (c) Nothing in this section shall supersede or otherwise affect the authority to recess for a closed or executive meeting in accordance with K.S.A. 75-4319, and amendments thereto.
- Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the Kansas register.
