1	AN ACT establishing the joint committee on child welfare system
2	oversight; concerning the safety and well-being of children in the child
3	welfare system in the state of Kansas; requiring an annual report to the
4	legislature.
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6	<i>Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:</i>
7	Section 1. (a) There is hereby established the joint committee on child
8	welfare system oversight. The joint committee shall review:
9	(1) The level of oversight and supervision by the Kansas department
10	for children and families over each entity that contracts with the Kansas
11	department for children and families to provide reintegration, foster care
12	and adoption services;
13	(2) the duties, responsibilities and contributions of state agencies,
14	nongovernmental entities and service providers that provide child welfare
15	services in the state of Kansas;
16	(3) the level of access to child welfare services, including, but not
17	limited to, health and mental health services and community-based
18	services, in the state of Kansas;
19	(4) the number of children in the child welfare system and the factors
20	that contribute to such number;
21	(5) the licensing standards for case managers working in the child
22	welfare system; and
23	(6) any other topic the joint committee deems necessary or
24	appropriate.
25	(b) The joint committee shall consist of -11 13 members of the
26	legislature appointed as follows:
27	(1) Two members of the house of representatives standing committee
28	on children and seniors appointed by the speaker of the house of
29	representatives;
30	(2) one member of the house of representatives standing committee
31	on children and seniors appointed by the minority leader of the house of
32	representatives;
33	(3) two members of the senate standing committee on public health
34	and welfare appointed by the president of the senate;
35	(4) one member of the senate standing committee on public health
36	and welfare appointed by the minority leader of the senate;

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1 (5) two members of the house of representatives appointed by the 2 speaker of the house of representatives;

3 (6) one member of the house of representatives appointed by the 4 minority leader of the house of representatives; and

5 (7) two members of the senate appointed by the president of the 6 senate:

7 (8) one member of the senate appointed by the minority leader of 8 the senate: and

9 (9) one member of the house of representatives appointed by the 10 majority leader of the house of representatives.

(c) Members shall be appointed for terms coinciding with the 11 legislative terms for which such members are elected or appointed. All 12 members appointed to fill vacancies in the membership of the joint 13 committee and all members appointed to succeed members appointed to 14 15 membership on the joint committee shall be appointed in the manner 16 provided for the original appointment of the member succeeded.

17 (d) (1) The first chairperson of the joint committee shall be appointed 18 by the speaker of the house of representatives from among the members of 19 the joint committee appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives. The chairperson and the vice-chairperson of the joint 20 21 committee shall alternate annually between the members appointed by the 22 speaker of the house of representatives and the president of the senate.

23 (2) The speaker of the house of representatives shall designate a 24 representative member to be the chairperson or the vice-chairperson of the 25 joint committee as provided in this section. The president of the Senate 26 shall designate a senator member to be the chairperson or the vice-27 chairperson of the joint committee as provided in this section. The ranking 28 minority member shall be from the same chamber as the chairperson. The 29 minority leader of the senate shall designate a senator member to be the 30 ranking minority member of the joint committee as provided in this 31 section. The minority leader of the house of representatives shall designate 32 a representative member to be the ranking minority member of the joint 33 committee as provided in this section.

34 (e) The members originally appointed as members of the joint 35 committee shall meet upon the call of the chairperson on or before August 36 1, 2021. Thereafter, the joint committee shall meet at least once in January 37 and once in April when the legislature is in regular session and at least 38 once for two consecutive days during each of the third and fourth calendar 39 quarters, on the call of the chairperson, but not to exceed six meetings in a 40 calendar year, except that additional meetings may be held on call of the 41 chairperson when urgent circumstances exist that require such meetings.

42 (f) SixSeven members of the joint committee shall constitute a 43 quorum.

1 (g) At the beginning of each regular session of the legislature, the 2 joint committee shall submit to the president of the senate, the speaker of 3 the house of representatives, the house standing committee on children and 4 seniors and the senate standing committee on public health and welfare a 5 written report that shall include recommended changes to current laws, 6 rules and regulations and policies regarding the safety and well-being of 7 children in the child welfare system in the state of Kansas.

8 (h) Members of the joint committee shall be paid compensation, 9 amounts for travel expenses and subsistence expenses or allowances as 10 provided in K.S.A. 75-3212, and amendments thereto, for attendance at 11 any meeting of the joint committee or any subcommittee meeting 12 authorized by the committee.

(i) In accordance with K.S.A. 46-1204, and amendments thereto, the
legislative coordinating council may provide for such professional services
as may be requested by the joint committee.

(j) The joint committee may make recommendations and introducelegislation as it deems necessary in performing its functions.

18 Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its19 publication in the statute book.
