## Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 1619

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION urging the Legislature to adopt the conclusions and recommendations of the 2021 Special Committee on Taxation regarding the fiscal future of Kansas.

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WHEREAS, The 2021 Special Committee on Taxation met on November 29 and 30, 2021, to study tax exemptions and abatements; and WHEREAS, The committee was directed to make recommendations

to the Legislature on any improvements or changes that should be considered; and

WHEREAS, The committee produced several recommendations; and

WHEREAS, The committee recommends that the Legislature should use state general fund ending balances and current receipts in excess of expenditures to pay down state debt and not for any increase to ongoing state expenditures; and

WHEREAS, The committee recommends that the Legislature should consider constitutional amendment proposals restricting the growth of the government; and

WHEREAS, The committee recommends that the Legislature should consider repealing all tax credits, exemptions and abatements that are not currently being used and have not been used for several years; and

WHEREAS, The committee recommends that the Legislature should devise a system of taxation that is equal and fair across the spectrum of forms of energy production; and

WHEREAS, The committee recommends that the Legislature should review Kansas income taxation of retirement income to resolve systematic inequities and review income taxation of Social Security benefits to eliminate marriage penalties; and

WHEREAS, The committee recommends that the Legislature should evaluate the existing Kansas property tax circuit breaker programs, defined as any property tax relief that limits or reduces taxes, and consider adding an additional program or expanding existing programs; and

WHEREAS, The 2021 Special Committee on Taxation believes that these conclusions and recommendations are in the best interest of Kansans across the state; and

Be it resolved by the Senate of the State of Kansas, the House of

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Representatives concurring therein: That the 2021 Special Committee on Taxation urges the adoption of the committee's conclusions and recommendations regarding the fiscal future of Kansas; and

Be it further resolved: That the Secretary of State shall send an enrolled copy of this resolution to the Chairman of the Interim Committee and Chairman of the Senate Committee on Assessment and Taxation, Senator Caryn Tyson, and the Vice Chairman of the Interim Committee and Chairman of the House Committee on Taxation, Representative Adam Smith.
