# **Agency Request**

The **agency** requests \$4.3 billion, including \$1.3 billion SGF, in expenditures for FY 2025. This is an all funds increase of \$27.8 million or 0.6 percent, and SGF increase of \$141.9 million, or 11.8 percent, above the FY 2024 revised estimate. The increases are primarily in commodities (\$5.6 million), aid to locals (\$11.2 million), and other assistance (\$70.9 million). The SGF increase is primarily due to enhancement requests.

#### **Governor's Recommendation**

The Governor recommends \$4.2 billion, including \$1.3 billion SGF, for FY 2025. This is a decrease of \$72.4 million or 1.7 percent below the agencies request. The decrease is primarily due to reduced expenditures in aid locals (\$36.4 million), other assistance (\$27.5 million) and salaries and wages (\$191,492). This is mainly due to the Governor not recommending most of the agencies enhancement requests.

- 6. Add \$9.7 million SGF for the Kansas Comprehensive Grant for FY 2025.
- 7. Delete \$7.0 million SGF for the Utility Contract increase enhancement for FY 2025.
- 8. Add \$3.0 million SGF for the Washburn Manufacturing Training Center for FY 2025.
- Add \$10.5 million SGF for the Technical Colleges Operating Grant for FY 2025.
- 10. Add \$5.0 million SGF for Community Colleges Capital Outlay aid for the ten community colleges that do not receive capital outlay aid for FY 2025.
- 11. Delete \$209,000 SGF for KBOR Support Staff and delete 2.0 FTE and review at Omnibus for FY 2025.
- 12. Delete \$14.2 million SGF for Need Based Aid for Students for FY 2025.
- 13. Add \$2.2 million SGF for the Kansas Osteopathic Scholarship for FY 2025.
- 14. Add \$270,000 SGF to Washburn Municipal Operating Grant for Dole Hall for operating costs for FY 2025.

#### Kansas State University

1. Add \$2.2 million SGF for the KSU Bio Security Research enhancement request for FY 2025.

- 2. Add \$5.0 million SGF for the KSU Water Wide Institute enhancement request for FY 2025.
- 3. Add \$25.0 million SGF for the KSU Ag Innovation Initiative enhancement request and add language requiring a \$1 for \$1 match with private non-state funds for FY 2025.
- 4. Add language for KSU authorizing bonding authority of \$25.0 million all from special revenue funds for remodeling project at the Strong Complex residence halls for FY 2025.
- 5. The Higher Education Budget Committee recognizes that the Kansas State University Dairy Teaching and Research Center is critical to support the expansion of the state's fastest growing agricultural segment, the Kansas Dairy Industry. According to a 2023 study, Kansas is positioned to take advantage of future dairy trends but must act quickly to ensure leadership in the space. KSU needs a modern working, research dairy with primary focus on the animal to address the sustainable intersection of animal health, water use, local inputs, milk content and emissions. The Committee encourages Kansas State University, the Dairy Industry and the state of Kansas to ensure this critical project is completed to support our growing dairy.

## University of Kansas Medical Center

- Add \$75.0 million SGF for the Cancer Research Facility at The University of Kansas Medical Center for FY 2025. This enhancement item was deleted from the Board of Regents and added to the University.
- 2. Add \$750,000 SGF for the purpose of supporting the Family Residency programs which include the Smoky Hill Family Residency, Ascension Via Christi and the Wesley Family Medicine Residency programs for FY 2025.

## Fort Hays State University

- 1. Add \$3.0 million SGF for the Regional Stabilization Fund to the FHSU university operating account for FY 2025.
- 2. Add \$400,000 SGF for instructional expenses for the Western Kansas Nursing Workforce Development enhancement request for FY 2025.
- 3. Add \$15.0 million SGF for the Western Kansas Nursing Workforce Development for classroom and laboratory renovations at Stroup Hall for FY 2025.
- 4. Add \$250,000 SGF for the Telehealth Certification for Mental Health Providers enhancement request for FY 2025.

#### Emporia State University

- 1. Add \$9.0 million SGF for the Emporia State Investment Model for FY 2025.

# Pittsburg State University

- Add a notation stating the committee recognizes the need for continued focus on improving Kansans ability to competently read. The Center for READing at Pittsburg State University serves children in southeast Kansas and across the state through virtual interventions and coaching session.

#### Wichita State University

- 1. Add \$5.0 million SGF for the WSU Business Partnership enhancement request for FY 2025. The Budget Committee notes that this will allow an additional 1,500 students to participate in the program.

# **Agency Request**

The **agency** requests \$4.3 billion, including \$1.3 billion SGF, in expenditures for FY 2025. This is an all funds increase of \$27.8 million or 0.6 percent, and SGF increase of \$141.9 million, or 11.8 percent, above the FY 2024 revised estimate. Delete \$4.9 million SGF from regents institutions until the chief executive officer for each institution certify to the State Finance Council that the institution did not engage in an Diversity, Equity and Inclusion activities for FY 2025. Add further language that funding be restored contingent on the passage of HB 2460 or similar legislation.

#### Governor Veto (SB 28)

The **Governor** vetoes the following:

- 1. Add \$4.0 million SGF for the Kansas State University Central Immersive Training Hub for FY 2025.
- Add \$1.2 million SGF for the Kansas State University Jet for FY 2025.
- 3. Add \$9.0 million SGF for the Emporia State Investment Model for FY 20225.
- 4. Add \$750,000 SGF for the University of Kansas Medical Center Wichita residency program for FY 2025.

- 5. Add \$2.2 million SGF for the Kansas Osteopathic Service Scholarship for FY 2025.
- Add language directing the agency to allow students attending for-profit, private career technical schools to be eligible to be awarded grants from the Kansas Promise Act and the Kansas Comprehensive Grant fro advanced manufacturing or building trades for FY 2025.

## **Omnibus Action (HB 2551)**

The **Legislature** made the following adjustments to the agency's budget for FY 2025:

## Kansas Board of Regents

- 1. Add \$10.0 million SGF for rural physical residency program expansion grant for FY 2025 and add language requiring a 2:1 match from non state or private moneys.
- 2. Add \$1.7 million SGF to the newly created Kansas Education Opportunity Scholarship for FY 2025.
- 3. Add \$1.1 million SGF for the Kansas EMERGE Program for FY 2025.
- 4. Add \$1.0 million SGF to the Kansas Nursing Initiative Grant for FY 2025 and add language that recipients may not accept employment as a contract nurse while receiving the grant.
- 5. Add \$1.0 million SGF to the Kansas Nursing Service Scholarship for FY 2025 and add language that recipients may not accept employment as a contract nurse while receiving the grant.
- 6. Add \$1.0 million for the Hero's Act Scholarship for FY 2025.
- 7. Adopt GBA NO.2, Item 13, to add \$2.5 million SGF for Needs Based Aid in FY 2025.
- 8. Add language that Wichita Tech Institute, Peaslee Tech and Heartland Welding Academy would be eligible to receive awards from the Promise Act Scholarship for FY 2025.
- 9. Add language to requiring the Promise Act Scholarship to expand eligible fields of study to include allied health professions for FY 2025.
- 10. Adopt GBA NO.2, Item 13, to transfer \$1.0 million SGF to the Kansas Adult Learner Grant fund in FY 2025.

# Kansas State University

- 1. Add \$4.0 million SGF for the Central Immersive Training Hub for FY 2025.
- Add \$1.2 million SGF for the KSU College of Aviation jet for FY 2025.
- 3. Add \$2.6 million SGF for the Dairy Facility Debt Service for FY 2025.

4. Add language authorizing binding authority of \$34.0 million, all from special revenue funds, including a 15.0 percent match of raised funds for capital improvement projects for the Dairy Debt facility at the Manhattan Campus for FY 2025.

# University of Kansas

1. Add \$12.0 million SGF to the newly created Kansas Law Enforcement Training Center account for FY 2025.

# Emporia State University

Add \$9.0 million SGF for the Emporia State Investment Model for FY 2025.

# Pittsburg State University

1. Add \$500,000 SGF for the Institute for emerging technologies center for graphene for FY 2025.

#### Wichita State University

1. Add language authorizing bonding authority of up to \$20.0 million all from special revenue funds for the construction and equipment of the NIAR technology and innovation buildings on the innovation campus for FY 2025.

#### **Governor Vetoes (HB 2251)**

The **Governor** vetoes the following:

- 1. Add 2.6 million SGF for the Dairy Facility Debt Service for FY 2025.
- 2. Add bonding authority language for the Dairy Debt Service Facility at KSU.
- 3. Add language expanding the Promise Act Scholarship program to include additional institutions such as Wichita Tech Institute, Peaslee Tech and Heartland Welding Academy.

#### **State Finance Council**

- 1. Add \$44.5 million, including \$13.7 million SGF, for a 2.5 percent salary adjustment for employees within the Postsecondary Education Systemwide distributed as a merit pool, for FY 2025.
- Restore \$35.7 million SGF to the state higher education institutions operating accounts as each chief executive officer for each institution has certified to the State Finance Council that the institution did not engage in any Diversity, Equity and Inclusion activities for FY 2025.
- 3. Restore \$21.8 million SGF to the state higher education institutions student financial

aid accounts upon the certification that the Board of Regents has distributed the state appropriation for the Kansas Comprehensive Grant with 50.0 percent going to the public universities and Washburn and the remaining 50.0 percent to the not-for-profit independent institutions.
